Appeal For Native Clergy

A gift, no matter how small, will help in the training of native clergy, the Rev. George S. Wood, diocesan director, Society for the Propagation of the Faith, said today.

The head of missionary activity in the Diocese of Rochester recalled that Pope John XXIII recently conferred honors upon an African, a Japanese and a Filipino making the first Cardinals of their lands. This, he said, is the result of an organization set up for the training of the native clergy, namely the Pontifical Society of St. Peter the Apostle for Native Clergy.

FATHER WOOD cited the fact that clergy placed in charge by the Apostles, in every community of the faithful, were not brought from outside but were chosen from the locality's faithful.

This has been the practice of the Church from the Apostles up to the new native Cardinals. Newly independent countries need more and more local clergy, Father Wood said. Especially is this true since it is becoming increasingly difficult for foreign missionaries to gain entry.

United States would not like the Japanese clergy to care for their spiritual needs, so the Catholics of Japan, for instance, would prefer native clergy. However, the proper funds are lacking in these lands to carry on this program of training and education," Father Wood said.

Rosary Tour Starts Sunday

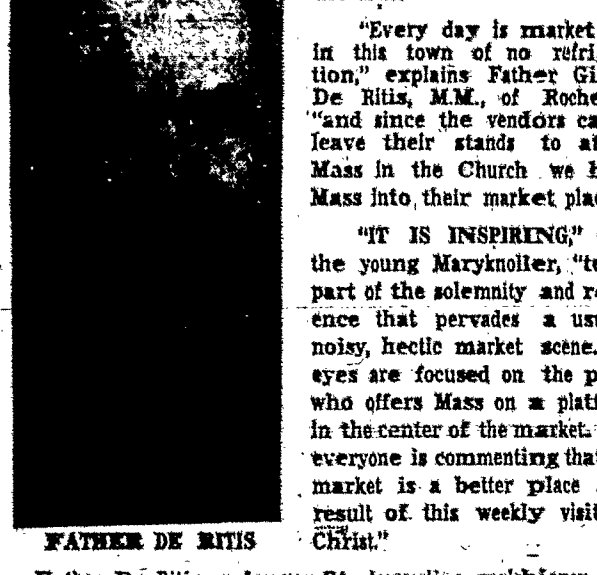
