

St. Patrick Drive Seeks \$185,000


Seneca Falls — Solicitation of pledges toward the proposed construction of an addition of the St. Patrick's Parochial School, with a minimum goal of \$185,000, will be conducted by a committee of approximately 400 men on Sunday, May 15 and Sunday, May 22.
