We don't even watch television together. When he's home, he just nips one bottle of beer after another. This is no atmosphere in which to raise children, yet what can I do?

I wish I knew a good solution to your problem, May, but so far, I haven't discovered one that's legal. There's plenty of room for hermits in. the world - the deserts are fairly empty, and most caves are still unoccupied, Hermits seem to have been more considerate in the past."

Another tells me that her husband spends as little time with the family as possible, cats his meals hurriedly, in silence, and expects utter quiet while he's reading the paper or watching television.

Most of these husbands have several traits in common. First, they do not seem capable of real companionship with the opposite sex, at least, not with their wives.

Second, they regard mararrangement, designed to take care of their needs in regard to room, board, and sex.

Men and women live in separate worlds, and there would be fewer family problems if women learned to keep their
