Verein Units



Nazareth Nuns Named For Fellowship

Three faculty members from the departments of Biology and Chemistry at Nazareth College have received fellowships for further study this summer in their respective fields. SISTER FRANCIS Solano, chairman of the department of Biology, has received a grant to do research on the thyroid gland, with Dr. S. Barker of the University of Alabama, at the University Medical Center in Birmingham. Sister will gain experience in Chromatography, metabolism work, and thyroid biochemistry. SISTER MARIE Augustine, chairman of the department of Chemistry, will participate in the Summer Institute for College Chemistry Teachers at the University of North Carolina, Chapel Hill, N.C., from June 13 to July 22. The Institute, which is sponsored by the National Science Foundation, will have fifty-five participants from all over the United States. The program, which consists of formal lectures and informal meetings on all phases of Chemistry, will also provide an opportunity for those studying to use the newest modern instruments, and to make field trips.


