## School Campaign 'Over The Top'

Auburn - St. Mary's School Building Fund Appeal has exceeded its financial objective by more than \$32,000, it was announced by Rt. Rev. Monsignor James D. Cuffney, honorary general chairman.

As a result of extended effort on the part of the Special Gifts and General Committee, the \$20,000 goal was actually surpassed Sunday afternoon, May 1.

To provide impetus for the great bulk of the parishioners, the Special Gifts Committee solicited \$8,000 of the total prior to the General Kickoff Dinner.

"Dr. William Ryan and George R. Shannon deserve tremendous credit," Msgr. Cuffney stated. "For the direct, physical and financial help that these men and

the fellow Special Gifts Committee members gave for St. Mary's."

AUXILIARY Bishop Lawrence B. Casey was the principal speaker at the General Kickoff Dinner which was held Saturday night at Auburn. The following day, more than 340 members of the men and women of the parish solicited pledges. The pledges are in the form of promises to help St. Mary's School fund over the next three years and are payable on a weekly, monthly or quarterly basis.

"The spirit of complete willingness to help, of genuine interest on the part of a great many of the men and women of the parish is the key to the success of this campaign," stated Msgr. Cuffney. "Many people worked extremely hard for this cause and that should be indicative of the feeling toward the new school project." Bishop Casey congratulated Msgr. Cuffney and his committeemen on an outstanding accomplishment, "an excellent campaign."
