Funeral Mass for Ruth John Hepworth who reared 127 foster children over 30 years was offered in St. Augustine Church, Saturday, May 14.

Mr. Hepworth, 76, of 205 Gardner Ave. died in his home, May 11, 1966. He had been ill about six months.

SOLEMN REQUIEM Mass was celebrated by the Rev. Albert V. Ryan assisted by Rev. Walter Fleming, deacon. Also present were the Rt. Rev. John M. Duffy, the Rev. Donald M. Mulcahy and the Rev. Francis H. Vogt.
