Salesman of Year Ponce, P.R. — (NC) — The Sales Executive Club has selected a bishop as its candidate for outstanding salesman of the year.

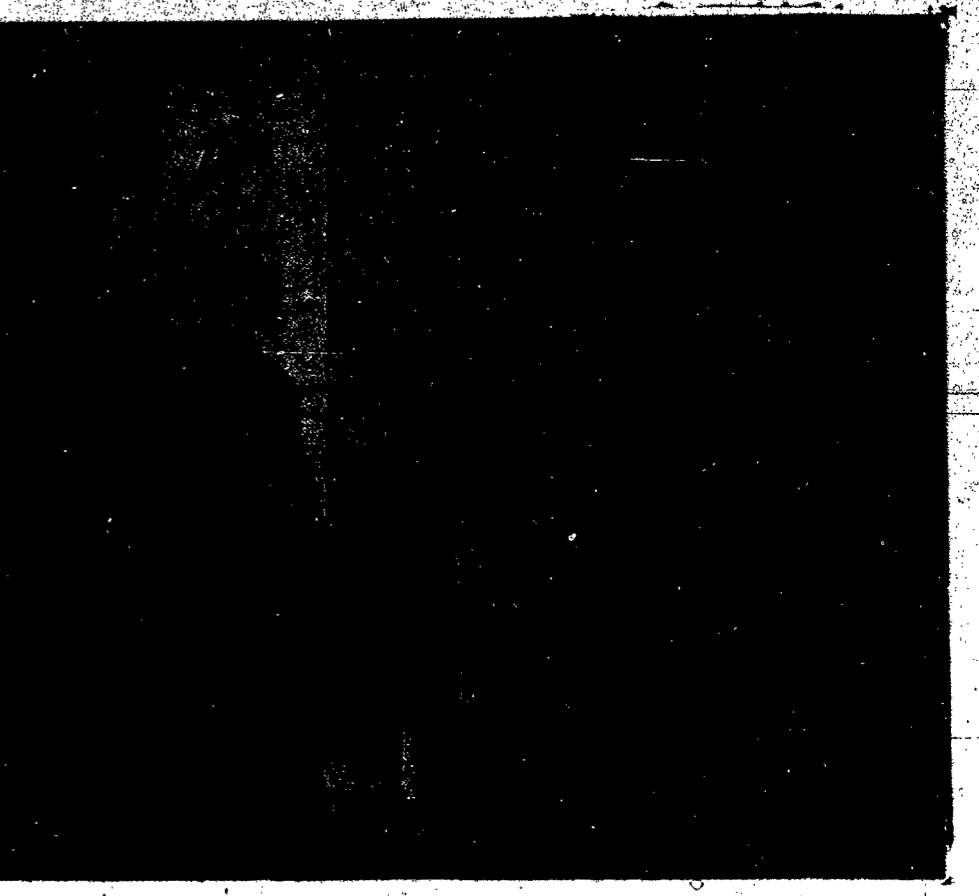
