**Churchmen Hail
India Food Aid**

New York — (RNS) — Officials of major religious relief organizations in America hailed here the signing of the unprecedented food pact under which a total of 17,000,000 tons of U.S. surplus grain will be sold to India in the next four years.

The agreement, signed by President Eisenhower and S. K. Patil, India's Minister for Food and Agriculture, calls for the biggest single sale of surplus food ever made by the U.S. For 57,000 bushels of wheat and 22,000,000 bags of rice, India will pay the U.S. the equivalent in rupees of \$1,276,000,000.

OF THIS AMOUNT, the U.S. will make available all but \$200,000,000 in rupees to the Indian government for economic development projects — one-half in loans, the rest in grants.

Such a program, utilizing on a vast scale America's surplus food, is the type of overseas aid to underdeveloped countries that many Protestants and Roman Catholic leaders have long been advocating.

Speaking for Catholic Relief Services, National Catholic Welfare Conference, which has an executive director, Msgr. Edward E. Swanson, proclaimed the food pact as "a bold and practical step toward loosening the grip which natural disasters have had on Indian people and helping free them from the prospect of recurrent periods of famine."

"Never before has a program of this magnitude been attempted," he observed. "Our wish for its success goes to President Eisenhower and the administrator of the 'Food for Peace' program."

The monumental food-aid assistance agreement, signed at

White House ceremony, was termed by the President as an "impact" agreement to help strengthen India's efforts to improve diets, meet emergency food needs and accelerate economic development.

Following the Mass, a wood-carved statue of Our Lady of Fatima, sent as a gift to American Catholics from Bishop Pereira Venancio, will be shrined in the sanctuary of the great church to the left of the main altar.

THE STATUE shows the Mother of Christ as she appeared to the three children on July 13, 1917, in a third apparition during which she revealed her Immaculate Heart and asked that Russia be consecrated to her Immaculate Heart.

First apparition of the Virgin to the Portuguese children occurred May 13 and the last Oct. 12. The late Pope Pius XII in 1943 consecrated the world with special reference to Russia, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary.

Preaching the sermon at the Mass in the national shrine will be Msgr. Harold V. Colgan.

**Cardinal Cushing

Fifteen hundred persons witnessed a dramatic and colorful departure in two airliners. Cardinal Cushing said he would not be the little pilgrims to pray for peace because "day by day we are losing the third world war even if it is a cold war."

**Prelate Meets
Red Leaders**

Zagreb — (RNS) — Archbishop Franjo Seper of Zagreb, Primate of the Roman Catholic Church in Yugoslavia, held a long conference here with Dr. Vladimir Bakarić, Communist leader of Croatia. This country's leading Catholic center, St. Mark's, was the first meeting between the two.

Tanjung, official Yugoslav news agency, in announcing the meeting, did not disclose the nature of the conference.

INFORMED sources, however, said that the two discussed possibilities for "normalizing" Church-State relations, which have become increasingly tense since World War II, chiefly because of the continued detention of the late Aloysius Cardinal Stepinac in his native village of Krasic from 1951 until his death last February.

In April when Archbishop Seper was appointed as head of the Zagreb archdiocese, in place of Cardinal Stepinac, Catholics in Croatia described the Church-State situation as slightly improved.

In reporting the meeting between Archbishop Seper and Dr. Bakarić, Tanjung also said that the Primates met with Stepan Ivokovic, head of the government's religious affairs commission in Croatia.

Yugoslavia broke relations with the Vatican in 1952 after the late Pope Pius XII elevated Archbishop Stepinac to the Primacy. At the time, the prelate had been confined by the Communists since his 1951 release from prison after serving five years of a 16-year term for alleged crimes against the state.
