First Solemn Mass of the Rev. Michael P. O'Sullivan, O.P., son of Mr. and Mrs. Daniel C. O'Sullivan, 16 Electric Ave., Rochester, will be celebrated in Sacred Heart Cathedral, Sunday, June 19 at 11 a.m.

Auxiliary Bishop Casey will preach the sermon. Father O'Sullivan will be assisted by Very Rev. Clement A. Drexelius, O.P., deacon and Rev. John S. Fitzhenry, O.P., subdeacon.

Father O'Sullivan will be one of a group of 25 Dominicans to be ordained by Archbishop Epifanio Vazquez, Apostolic Delegate to the United States in St. Dominic's Church, Washington, D.C. on Thursday, June 16 at 9 a.m.

Five Diocesan Priests Mark 40 Years

Five veteran priests of the Rochester Diocese will mark their 40th anniversary this Sunday.

They were ordained in old St. Patrick's Cathedral by Syracuse Bishop John Grimes May 29, 1920.

The jubilarians are: Rt. Rev. Msgr. Patrick Moffatt, pastor of St. Francis Xavier Church, Rochester.

Rt. Rev. Msgr. Francis J. Lane, retired chaplain of Elmira Reformatory, Elmira.

Rev. John M. Baksys, pastor emeritus of St. George Church, Rochester.

Rev. William S. Hayes, pastor of St. Anthony's Church, Groton.

Rev. Robert A. Keleher, pastor of St. Charles Borromeo Church, Greece.

Following are details of the anniversary observances and a biographical sketch of each jubilarian.

Monsignor Moffatt has been pastor at St. Francis Xavier Church for 22 years. He has a wide reputation for his pioneering efforts to carry out the apostolate of religious instruction program for public school children.

He attended St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries and following ordination was assigned curate at Mt. Carmel parish, Rochester. In 1927 he took charge of Our Lady of Sorrows mission chapel served by priests of Mt. Carmel. He was named to his present post as pastor of St. Francis Xavier Church in 1938. Throughout his 40 years of priesthood, Monsignor Moffatt has been in charge of Italian-speaking congregations and is well known for his help to immigrants to aid them adapt to their new homeland.

He was named a Monsignor in 1956. He will mark his jubilee privately.

Monsignor Lane will also observe his 40th anniversary privately. He retired last July after 37 years as chaplain of Elmira Reformatory. The dean of American prison chaplains served two years as assistant pastor of Immaculate Conception Church, Rochester, following his ordination in 1920. He was then assigned to his "apostolate behind bars."

In his near 40-year years at the southern tier prison, Monsignor Lane won the respect of hundreds of hardened criminals whose lives he changed through his counsel and prayers.

He is perhaps best known for his "Father Lane's Gang" — an

organization of former inmates of "the Hill."

The standing monument to his work is the St. John Bosco chapel, first such structure ever built within prison walls in this country. His work won repeated recognition from civic and church leaders and he received the "special blessing" of Pope Pius XII in 1949. Earlier, Monsignor Lane was raised to the rank of domestic prelate in 1947.

He was born April 10, 1894, the son of Joseph Lane and Anna McGinn Lane of Rochester. He attended Holy Redeemer school, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries.

Father Baksys, who retired from active duty four years ago, will mark his jubilee privately.

He celebrated his silver jubilee at pastor of St. George Church, Rochester, in 1955. In addition to his regular pastoral duties, Father Baksys worked tirelessly to aid refugees from his native Lithuania, a nation occupied by Soviet forces in 1940 and under Communist domination since that date.

Through his efforts and aided by parishioners, he brought over 500 Lithuanian exiles to this country.

Father Baksys is a graduate of St. Bernard's Seminary and served at St. Joseph Church, Watertown, Conn., following his ordination in 1920. He then was named to Holy Trinity Church, Hartford, and came to Rochester in 1930 to be pastor of the Lithuanian parish here.

He completed the school then under construction and supervised construction of the present church in 1935.

Father Hayes' 40th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood coincides with his 20th year as pastor of St. Anthony's Church, Groton.

He will celebrate his jubilee Sept. 29, 8:30 a.m. He has scheduled no public observance of his anniversary, however.

Father Hayes, a native of Rochester, was born Nov. 3, 1895, the son of Maurice A. Hayes and Julia A. McAviney Hayes.

He attended St. Augustine and Holy Apostles schools, St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries and was ordained May 29, 1920.

He was assistant pastor at St. George's Church, Auburn, 1920 to 1921; Blessed Sacrament Church, Rochester, 1921 to 1924; St. Michael's, Penn Yan, and St. Andrew's, Dundee, 1924 to 1929; St. Patrick's, Corning, 1929 to 1934.

He was named pastor of Holy

Angels, Nurdi, and Holy Name building program that has included new church, new school, new convent and new rectory.

He will mark his 40th anniversary as a priest by celebrating High Mass this Sunday, May 29, at 10 a.m.
