Franciscan, Avoca Native Marks 25 Years

St. Bonaventure, N.Y.—The Rev. Aurelius Loop, Franciscan priest member of St. Bonaventure University marked his silver jubilee of ordination with a Mass of Thanksgiving on Tuesday, May 31.

A native of the Rochester Diocese, Father Loop was born in Avoca, N.Y., and has been general manager and treasurer of the university since 1952. He first joined the faculty in 1937 as a teacher of chemistry. He was a professor of chemistry at the U.S. Navy for his training of naval cadets who were on campus during the early days of the second World War.

He holds the B.A. degree from St. Bonaventure and the master's degree from Columbia. Father Loop's mother, Mrs. Ernest Loop, resides in Olliver St., Avoca.

Lima Pastor Marks 45 Years As Priest

The Rt. Rev. Msgr. John M. Ball, V.F., pastor of St. Rose Church, Lima, will observe the 45th anniversary of his ordination on Sunday, June 12.

The parishioners plan to honor Msgr. Ball, who has been pastor at St. Rose for the past 26 years, by presenting him with a special gift at a reception on the church lawn, Sunday at 2 p.m. Preceding the reception sponsored by the various organizations of the parish, there will be prayers of thanksgiving and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament in church.

THE GENERAL CHAIRMAN in charge of arrangements is James H. Gleason, Town Supervisor of Lima, and the chairman of the reception committee is Miss Mary Parisella.

All former members of St. Rose parish and friends of the jubilarian are invited.

Msgr. Ball, son of Edward C. and Maria Kavanagh Ball, was born in Rochester on May 24, 1889. After attending St. Monica's grammar school, Rochester, he began his studies for the priesthood at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminaries. He was ordained on June 12, 1915, by the late Archbishop Thomas F. Hickey in the old St. Patrick's Cathedral. His first appointment as a newly-ordained priest was as assistant at the Cathedral and teacher at the former Cathedral High School.

In 1918 he was transferred to St. Mary's in Auburn as assistant to the Rev. William Payne and in the following year he came assistant at St. Ann's in Palmyra. After one year he returned to St. Mary's in Auburn and remained here until 1922 when he was appointed pastor of St. Patrick's Church, Cato.

The late Cardinal Mooney, then Bishop of Rochester, appointed Father Ball as the first Rural Life Director in 1908, a position he held for five years. Under the guidance of Father Ball the present system of Rural Vacation Schools was established. In 1964 Bishop Kearney appointed him Dean of Livingston County. Two years later he was made a Domestic Prelate.
