Classics With A Chaser

Vocalist Caterina Valente and conductor Werner Muller have trumped up a dandy idea and recorded it as RCA Victor. The album is called "Classics With A Chaser" and is concerned with pop songs which descend from favorite classical works.

The idea of setting Tin-Pan-Alley-type words to the melody of the great classical composers began with the Pop arrangement of the opening theme of Tchaikovsky's "Piano Concerto No. 1 in B Flat Minor." Retitled "Tonight We Love" it was turned into a million-and-more selling recording by Freddy Martin in the early Forties.

Dyed-in-the-wool classical music-lovers are still in a state of shock over what has been done to their beloved Peter Ilich. But it must be stated that an awful lot of musical joy and satisfaction have occurred to the Pop-minded listening and dancing public via "Tonight We Love."

AND NO one can say that this concerto itself was ruined after this episode because a fellow named Van Cliburn turned it into one of the bestselling classical albums in history in 1958. So whether you want to call this album "Classics For People Who Don't Like Pop Music" or "Pop Music for People Who Don't Like Classics" it will still come out with two points. Here's how the album is put together. Werner Muller first plays a part of the classical work in its original form, then Miss Valente sings the variations in her own winning way.
