

CYO Swimming Program To Open For Summer

The C.Y.O. swimming pool will begin a summer schedule with many new additions and a few changes in the program.

One of the additions will be a Red Cross life saving and water safety course to begin on June 15. This will be held on Wednesdays throughout the summer and will start at 6:45 p.m. and end at 8 p.m.

The class will be available to girls and women interested in studying life saving techniques at 50 Chestnut Street. or in earning their senior life savings badge as a necessary requirement for life guards or camp counselor positions or to those who wish to renew their life saving certificates.

Once earned, the life saving certificates remain in-force for three years.

ANOTHER ADDITION to the summer program will be a course in synchronized swimming, sometimes known as "water ballet." This course is intended primarily for girls of high school age, although adult women may also participate.

This class will be held on Wednesdays throughout the summer also, but from 5 p.m. until 6 p.m. The first session will start on June 23. This is offered to high school girls in place of the regular high school girls swim period on Friday nights.

The C.Y.O. will also offer Family Swim night on Friday evening through the summer. There will be two periods of family swim, the first from 7 p.m. until 9 p.m. and the second from 8 p.m. until 9 p.m.

The new monastery for Carmelite monks is under construction at Waverly. Art Exhibit At Munich

Munich — (RNS) — One of the world's most famous art treasures is scheduled to be brought here from Monza, near Milan, Italy, for display at the 37th International Eucharistic Congress in August.

It is the renowned Iron Crown of the royal treasure of the Lombards, a Germanic tribe which conquered Italy in the 6th century. The treasure is the crown of almost all German kings, Napoleon I, and Emperor Ferdinand I of Austria were crowned with it.

The whole treasure, which includes many other priceless pieces of sacred art, will be on exhibition, "Bavarian Plety 1400 Years of Christian Bavaris," to be shown during the Eucharistic Congress at the Munich City Museum.
