Prelate Urges College Students Ready Answer To Race Problem

Cape Town, South Africa — Archbishop Owen McCann of Cape Town has called for the "mobilization of a Christian opinion" toward seeking a solution to South Africa's racial problem.

"A spirit of recrimination should not be allowed to enter into the efforts to find this solution," he declared.

The Catholic prelate had been asked to comment on the charges and countercharges between the Most Rev. Joost de Blank, Anglican Archbishop of Cape Town, and leaders of the Dutch Reformed churches in South Africa.

Archbishop de Blank had issued a statement declaring that unless the Dutch Reformed churches repudiated compulsory apartheid—the racial separation policy of the South African government—the Anglican Church in South Africa could "no longer be associated with them in any council or federation."

ARCHBISHOP de Blank also asked the World Council of Churches to send "a fact finding team to South Africa to investigate the racial situation at first hand."

Spokesmen for the Dutch Reformed church here in reply charged that the Anglican church has "on various occasions" broken an agreement to promote a "spirit of trust." The actions of Archbishop de Blank have caused "more alienation," they said, and "future cooperation with him has become impossible."

College Students Ready For Oklahoma Mission

Eleven students and two religious from Nazareth College will leave by plane for Oklahoma City on Saturday, June 11.

For six weeks during the summer, the girls will participate in a program of catechetical instruction and parish census-taking.

They will work under the supervision of the Rev. John J. Sullivan, whose visit to Nazareth last November inspired the trip, a "first" for Nazareth's mission-minded students.

After a week of orientation, the students will work in teams of two or three in both city and rural areas, reporting to headquarters in Oklahoma City each weekend.

The school, under supervision of the American Jesuits of the Wisconsin Province, opened during the April demonstrations which led to the resignations of the government headed by President Syngman Rhee. It suspended classes after two days, at 219 Bayway Drive, Webster but reopened later.

This follows reports in Sudan of "mass conversions" to the Islam religion and action by the Sudanese government in expelling many foreign Christian missionaries.

Since April 1957, when the country's mission schools were nationalized, the Arab government has made it increasingly difficult for Christian missionaries in Sudan.

Soviet Envoy At Church Rite

Jerusalem — (RNS) — Pentecost Monday was marked here by the celebration of the Solemn Liturgy in the Russian Orthodox Cathedral of the Holy Trinity, a rite attended by Oriental Church leaders and Western and Eastern diplomats, including Soviet Ambassador Mikhail Bodrov.

The large congregation also comprised local Greeks and Arabs, chiefly Christian Orthodox students from Hebrew University, who took Holy Communion as a group.

Wedding On TV

London — (NC) — A Catholic wedding ceremony has been televised for the first time in Britain.

The wedding in Middlebrough cathedral of 21-year-old Jean Fraser and 24-year-old John Whaley was broadcast during the Sunday time allotted to Catholic ceremonies by the British Broadcasting Corporation.

Warsaw — (RNS) — An appeal for funds to help maintain the Catholic University of Lublin — the only Catholic institution of higher learning in Communist Poland — was made by Tygodnik Powstancy, Catholic weekly published in Cracow.

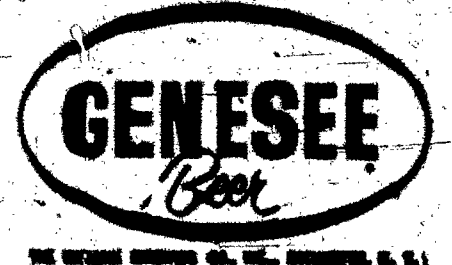
