



Vatican City — (RNS) — The Sacred Congregation of Rites has discussed the beatification of an Italian cardinal who is regarded as one of the greatest figures of the church in modern times.

The cause is that of Andrei Cardinal Ferrari, Archpriest of Milan, who died in 1921 at the age of 70 after having lived long enough to witness the reputation of a long-sacrificed dream of the establishment of the Catholic University of the Sacred Heart in the extent See he had headed for 25 years.

In Milan today are many people who recall the extraordinary fortitude and courage with which the cardinal — a victim of cancer of the throat — endured three months of constant suffering before breathing his last on Feb. 2, 1921.

Not only did Cardinal Ferrari insist on visiting the crowds of pilgrims who flocked to see him daily, allowing no one to be turned away, but he wrote a last pastoral letter of farewell with more instructions and grieve exhortations to his successor.
