Catholic Nuns

A 14th century Italian monastery near Florence is the main stage for the Paramount Theatre's "CONSPIRACY OF HEARTS." This movie for the whole family promises an exceptional blend of pathos, shining bravery and suspense for 118 minutes.

This is a beautiful story of nuns who smuggle little Jewish orphans of World War II from a nearby concentration camp into their own cellars, and then through the partisans to eventual homes in Palestine. When the diabolical Nazi commandant of the camp invades the scene of mercy and love, the scales are tipped toward hair-raising melodrama and happy-ending plot-trickery.

When on YOM KIPPUR, a day of prayer and fasting, the children refuse food, Mother Katharine (beautifully and wittily played by Lilli Palmer) scandalizes the more conservative sisters by finding a Rabbi in service with the underground. His ceremonial has reached the prayer for the dead mothers and fathers, brothers and sisters in the dungeon tabernacle and the sisters have fled to Mass when two Nazi terrorists found in the door. The sight of the two religious worshipping under one roof, is a touching and inspiring experience.

The "Visitors" appear to be supererogatory disciples of the late Von Stroheim. Fortunately, their fellow officer (Ronald Lewis, an excellent performer) and all their soldiers are Italian; near the end of their patience with the nuns, it makes a climax for nuns and soldiers alike when each must meet according to his own beliefs. Shock and violence are a part of it, but it attains a nobility of feeling as well that decides the final outcome. Be sure to see this excellent movie. It is top entertainment and an opportunity to encourage GOOD movies.

Theatre News Twelfth Night By EUPHEMIA WYATT

TWELFTH NIGHT: — Facing the confluence of the Housatonic River with the Long Island Sound, The American Shakespeare Festival Theatre with its tall pines, dull grey timbers and red geraniums, repays a visit more than ever now that Mr. Ter-Aruntian, the designer, has replaced the dreary Venetian blinds which once boxed in the whole stage with a daintily bizarre background of sea shells — presumably oyster — scattered over a scrim through which a golden light filters with an effect that is soothing and lovely. On one side of the stage is the main pavilion which serves the Duke Orsino; on the other a delicately wrought gilded ironwork portico to the Lady Olivia's villa.

Instead of the fabled Myria, the place is now some nineteenth century watering resort where the Duke is in charge of the naval station. This gives Viola opportunity to wear a very smart blue jacketed uniform and, for once, she and her brother, Sebastian, now a midshipman are really twins. This Sebastian, whose name is Clayton Corzate, also contrives to impress himself on the audience as an unusual young man. Setting the comedy so far forward in time, makes less difference than one would suppose, although the romance may seem less poetical when spoken by Orsino and Viola in white duck trousers.

Fortunately the round black sailor hat is very becoming to Miss Katherine Hepburn; Malvolio, well played by Richard Waring, still wears black knee breeches as chamberlain; Feste, the Fool, is now an old man in faded motley, giving fine support to the comedy. Margaret Phillips is more intelligent than ravishing as Olivia; she and her ladies in billowy muslins, hide their faces from Caesar's behind black lace parasols.

Loring Smith's genial Sir Toby looks like a boisterous Mr. Pickwick and Sir Andrew Aguecheek is a Peter Piper with fishing tackle. Two little red and white bathing houses on wheels serve as concealment for Maria and Sir Toby from Malvolio and one also becomes his prison. Sada Thompson is very incarnation of comedy and her dimpling laugh makes her a perfect Miss Moppet. Deakie Davis, young as he is, seems over portly for Viola's dream prince. Miss Hepburn's gay sense of comedy gives freshness to Viola and while she faces her fate bravely, the scene is a pony play not horse play. After the baroque beauty of the Old Vic TWELFTH NIGHT, Jack Landau's seaside version proves the adaptability of William Shakespeare and the light-heartedness of his humor.

ERNEST IN LOVE — A most agreeable evening of melodious sophistication and nineteenth century wit is offered in this miniature musical in which the epigrams of Oscar Wilde have been set to music and the romantic adventures of John and Algy as set forth in THE IMPORTANCE OF BEING ERNEST are shown in London and Hertfordshire by the scenic painting of a charming orchestra of piano bass, asoon, clarinet and flute. He attractive cast both speak and sing with distinction, the sets and costumes have style and altogether it is one of the best summer bar-paints. Has just moved to the Cherry Lane (Commerce St.).

Tally-Ho Camp Opens 13th Season Tally-Ho Music Camp announces the opening of their 13th season on July 3.
