Clyde Parish Slates Plans For Renovation

Clyde — Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence E. Casey will be the featured speaker at the General Committee Kickoff Dinner to be held in St. John's Parish Hall, Clyde on Saturday, June 18 beginning at 6:30 p.m. The dinner is sponsored by the Catholic Daughters of America, Court Clearing No. 924, and is assisted by the ladies of the parish.

The campaign, St. John's Parish Financial Aid Appeal, is being conducted to raise funds to renovate various church properties presently in need of repair, according to the Rev. Paul J. Cuddy, pastor.

THE RENOVATION PLANS include painting of the church and school, construction of a new security enlargement of the present parish and recreational area, a new exit to the parking lot, plumbing in the church, a new school drainage system, and insulation and refurnishing of the present convent. Also included in the building plans will be the construction of new office space, reception room, and convent room in the present rectory.

The enlistment program of the appeal, which has been going on for the past five weeks, has been completed with an over-enlistment of more than 50 per cent of the goal. This brings a new sense of urgency to the campaign, which is being spearheaded by the Rev. Father Cuddy, who is urging the parishioners to contribute to this most worthy cause.

"I am very pleased and happy at the fine response of our members to our appeal for volunteer workers," stated the pastor. "I wish to extend my congratulations and heartfelt thanks for the splendid work that has been accomplished. I hope and pray that this spirit of unity will prevail among all the parishioners when they are asked to contribute to this most worthy cause."

THE GENERAL SOLICITATION will take place on Sunday, June 19, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. All parishioners are asked to contribute over a three year period by means of a contribution card. Payments may be made weekly, monthly, or as desired. Special envelopes will be mailed to every one who makes a pledge.

Basilians To Ordain Four Aquinas Grads

Four Rochester men will be among the eighteen Basilians ordained to the Holy Priesthood by His Eminence James Cardinal McGowan, Archbishop of Toronto on Wednesday, June 29 at 9:30 a.m.

Holy Orders will be conferred by the Cardinal in St. Basil's Church, Toronto. All four of the new priests were former Aquinas Institute graduates and were members of the Aquinas Faculty from 1955 to 1957.

The new priests are: the Rev. Thomas F. Dugan, C.S.B. of St. John the Evangelist Parish (Humboldt St.); the Rev. Albert R. Giesels, C.S.B. of St. Helen's Parish; the Rev. Robert T. O'Halloran, C.S.B. of St. Salome's Parish; the Rev. Frederick J. Wajda, C.S.B. of St. Stanislaus Parish.

FATHER THOMAS DUGAN, C.S.B. is the son of Mr. R. Dugan of 2135 East Main St. and the late Mr. Dugan. He attended St. John the Evangelist Parish School and Aquinas Institute in 1950. He entered St. Basil's Novitiate in Rochester. After the Novitiate year he studied at St. Michael's College, Toronto, where he received his Bachelor of Arts.

He was then appointed to the faculty of Aquinas Institute for two years, during which time he also attended the University of Rochester and received a Master's degree in Education. During the past three years Father Dugan was at St. Basil's Seminary, Toronto studying Theology and preparing for the Priesthood.

Following ordination he will spend another year in Toronto to finish his studies.

Father Dugan will celebrate his First Solemn Mass in St. John the Evangelist Church on Saturday, July 2, at 9:00 a.m. Mr. Charles Boyle, pastor, will be assistant priest. Rev. Summer Session Set At Women's College

The Summer Session at Nazareth College will open on Monday, June 27, and will continue through August 6. Courses on graduate and undergraduate levels are open to all qualified people and the methods of historical research.

On the undergraduate level, in the department of music, conducting is open to graduate students, as well as a course in Pivotal Problems in School. There will also be a course in phonetics, one in earth science, and a course in principles of personality development.

The mathematics department will offer two courses for teachers, one for high school teachers and one for 7th and 8th grade teachers.

Courses in the elementary teacher education division will be offered for religious and lay teachers in parochial schools. They will cover material in science, art, music, English and social studies.

Two courses in science, the first summer session, a two-year summer program are available for teachers. They will cover work in book selection, and library material for children, and a course on school libraries; their function and administration. Work may also be begun this summer on a library project to be submitted in the second semester.

Sister Margaret Teresa, chairman of the English department, will offer a course in bibliography for students in the graduate division of the summer session. The Art of Fiction, is the course being presented by Sister Thomas Marion in the field of English.

DR. JAMES A. WHITE, and Dr. William R. Gwynn will teach graduate students in the department of history. Dr. White's Ancient Order of Hibernians in American History, and Dr. Gwynn's on an exploration of the nature of historical knowledge, the tasks of the historian.
