WARSAW — (RNS) — Father Maksymilian Waszkiewicz, a priest in Kurdwanow, a village near Warsaw, was sentenced to 18 months imprisonment by court here for alleged "violations of the freedom of conscience."

### Laymen Given Refugee Award

GENEVA — (RNS) — Two American laymen—one a Protestant and the other a Catholic—were honored at a special luncheon here by the Standing Conference of Voluntary Agencies Working for Refugees for their long years of service in refugee work.

The Protestant layman was Donald E. Anderson of Minneapolis, Minn., who is leaving his post here as the Lutheran World Federation's secretary for resettlement and material relief to become a liaison officer with the United Nations Food and Agriculture Organization in Rome.

His Catholic companion was George L. Warren, Jr., who is returning to the U. S. State Department in Washington for reassignment after sharing in refugee aid work in Europe and the Middle East.

### Father Of Two Religious, J. F. Kelly Requiem Held

FUNERAL MASS for John F. Kelly, father of a Jesuit priest and of a Christian Brother was offered in St. Theodore's Church, Gates on June 17.

Mr. Kelly, a retired executive of General Railway Signal Company and former West Gates Water District Commissioner, died June 12, 1960, at St. Mary's Hospital.

Solemn Requiem Mass was celebrated by Rev. Raymond J. Epping assisted by Rev. James R. Barnett, S.J., as deacon and Rev. Robert A. White, S.J., sub-deacon.

He was assistant to the president of General Railway Signal prior to his retirement. He had been employed in an executive capacity with other firms after he was graduated from Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute. As water commissioner for 20 years he served as chairman for several years.

MR. KELLY is survived by his wife, Loreto; five sons, Eugene and Donald of Rochester; Robert of Dallas, Texas; the Rev. Frederick Kelly, Jesuit priest in the Philippines and brother Bernard Thomas of the Brothers of the Christian Schools, Manhattan College; a daughter, Mrs. Frank Landry of Rochester; 14 grandchildren; five great-grandchildren; a sister, Mrs. Martin Sweeney of Waton, W.Va., and three brothers—Leo of Buffalo, Md., Francis of Atlantic City, and G. A. Kelly of Kansas City, Mo.

Interment was in Holy Cemetery.

ROME — (RNS) — Observatore Della Domenica, Vatican city weekly, reported that priests speaking many languages will be available in all Rome churches near the site of the Olympic Games to hear the confessions of those attending or participating in the event.

The Vatican, it added, is meanwhile planning to provide priests and laymen who act as guides to the Roman Catholic and various city churches and shrines for the exceptionally large number of tourists expected in Rome during the Games.

The charges are directed particularly against anti-religious literature distributed during recent athletic youth dedication ceremonies held in various West German centers including Cologne, under the auspices of the Free Thinkers' association. One of the books was entitled "The Plague of God."
