She is ready to leave the hospital but her mother is expecting a sixth child and her father has recently undergone serious surgery.

The child needs a quiet home, an afternoon nap and good meals.

The Catholic Family Center is faced with an average of five such cases a week—children in need of a "home away from home" while they convalesce from illness.

Some are bed-ridden; most are able to be up and around, but require medicine or supervision lest they "over do."

Mrs. Clarence Green is currently seeking homes where these children can receive this special care. She said all expenses will be met by the parish or the Catholic Family Center.
