Said Killed

Vientiane — (RNS) — An Italian Catholic priest who disappeared into the Laos jungle, which is infested with pro-Communist rebels, is feared to have been killed.

He is Father Mario Borzaga, 77, of Trento, Italy, who was working with the Order of Oblates of Mary in Laos at the time.

Last April, Father Borzaga was sent into the jungle accompanied by mountain tribesmen as guides. He was traveling from Kiu Kachin, some 50 miles south of Luang Prabang, and was expected back in three days. But neither Father Borzaga nor any members of his party have been heard from.

Everyone loves good fried chicken but when the flavor of the chicken is just a little different, and the crispy coating on the outside is specially seasoned . . . you've a delicacy that merits compliments.

It's easy as can be to prepare this chicken. You can select frying chickens or your favorite parts. Chicken is plentiful and that means the price is right. It is one of the best meats buys at the present time. Here's the new twist to this wonderful recipe for fried chicken. First dip each piece of chicken in buttermilk . . . and then in seasoned flour. The trick seasoning in the flour is something different. After coating the chicken well with the flour it is ready to fry.

MANY HOME-MAKERS shy away from frying on top of the stove. I like the over-frying method myself. It's so easy and if you're not familiar with it this is what you do. Melt butter in a shallow pan . . . in a hot oven at 400 degrees. When the butter is melted arrange the pieces of coated chicken in the pan. Do not pile the pieces of chicken on top of each other.

As you arrange the chicken in the pan, with tongs, turn

Having a picnic for the 4th of July? Here's a wonderful new recipe from the Home Economics Division of Swift and Company. It's called Beau Catcher Fried Chicken . . . and I think it's appropriately named. Men will certainly praise you when you serve it.

Should the guests be a little late, just turn the oven down to about 200 degrees and if necessary brush with a little additional butter.

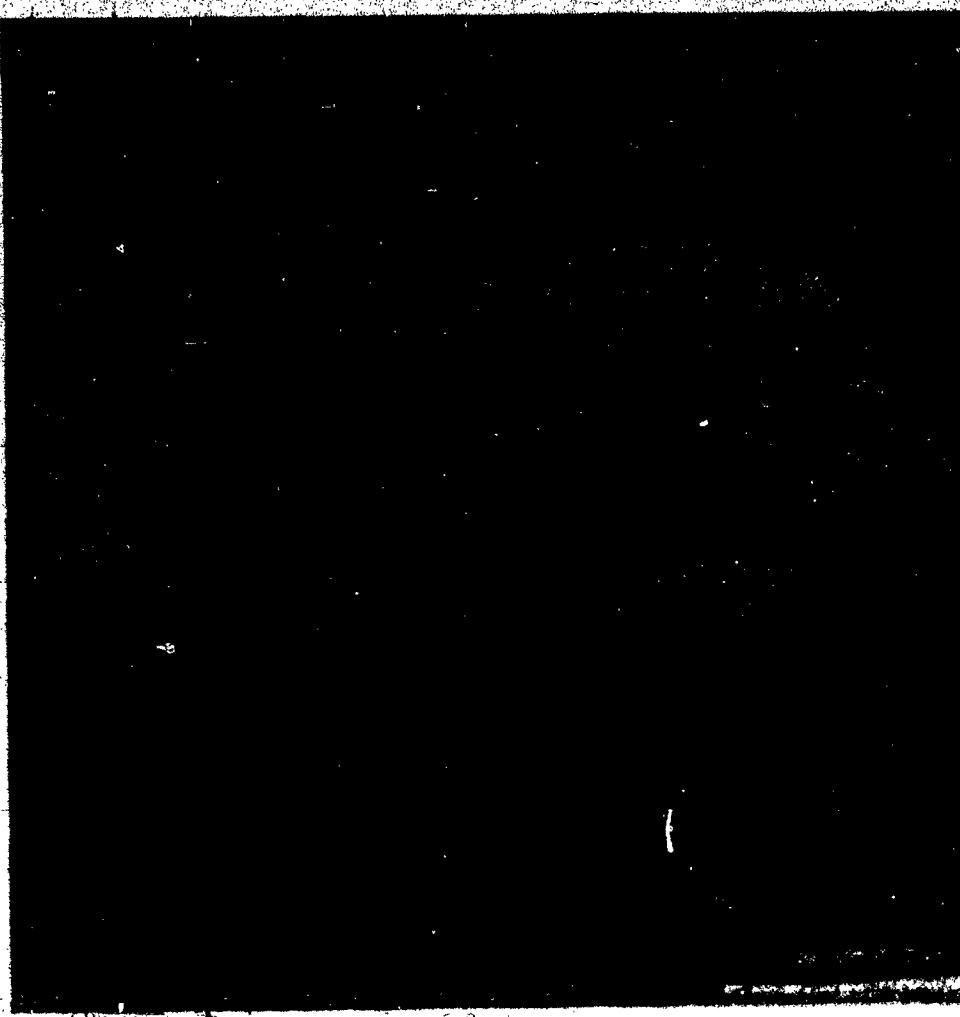
SEERVE THE golden browned, crisply fried chicken in a napkin-lined basket . . . or on a large platter. Add a bow trim to the basket if you like. What a treat this is for hungry appetites. To complete the menu for your 4th of July picnic serve corn on the cob, lots of cold sliced red ripe tomatoes, served on a large platter with crisp green, perfect potato salad, hot rolls, strawberry shortcake and beverages.

Here's the exact recipe for BEAU CATCHER FRIED CHICKEN.

BEAU CATCHER FRIED CHICKEN
Yield: 4 servings
1 frying chicken, cut up or favorite parts
1/2 c. buttermilk
1 c. flour
2 t. salt
1/2 t. pepper
2 t. paprika
1/2 t. leaf thyme
2 T. dried minced onion
3/4 c. butter

Dip chicken pieces into buttermilk and then into a mixture of flour, salt, pepper, paprika, thyme, and minced onion. Melt butter in a shallow baking pan in a hot oven 400 degrees. Remove baking pan from oven. As pieces of floured chicken are placed in pan, turn to coat with butter, then bake skin side down for 30 minutes. Turn chicken. Bake another 30 minutes or till tender.

IT SEEMS as though juicy strawberries are here today and then gone tomorrow. Mary has been singing the praises of strawberries ever since their cultivation back in the 18th century. Remember Curly Legs from Old Mother Goose. "You'll sit on a cushion and sew a fine seam, and feed upon strawberries, sugar and cream." Who could resist a good old fashioned shortcake made with biscuit dough with extra shortening, egg and sugar. That's the kind I like the best. Thin, baked, split, buttered and filled and covered with sweetened berries and topped with cream.



This recipe is a BEAU Catcher in shortening with a pastry blender. Combine milk and egg and add to flour mixture. Turn out on lightly floured surface and knead lightly for about 2 minutes. For large layered shortcake divide dough in half and roll each half into a 9 inch circle. Fit one circle into lightly greased 9 inch layer cake pan. Brush with melted butter and top with second circle. Separate layers when baked.

BISCUIT SHORTCAKE
1/2 c. shortening
2 c. sifted flour
1/2 c. sugar
4 t. baking powder
1/2 c. milk
3 to 4 cups sliced sweetened strawberries
Whipped cream
Sift flour, sugar and salt.

This is easier than baking the dough in one big cake and trying to split layers after baking. Fill shortcake with berries, and cover the top of the shortcake also. Top with whipped cream.

"Heart of Jesus, Tabernacle of the Most High, have mercy on us."

They will be participating in special seminars in Brazil, Colombia, France, Germany, and Italy which will make them better acquainted with the language, literature, people, and cultural heritage of these lands.

'Savage Eye' Movie Class C

New York — (NC) — The National Legion of Decency has placed in its condemned classification the semidocumentary movie "Savage Eye," distributed by Trans-Lux Kinology International.
"The treatment of this semidocumentary film involves blatant violations of Judeo-Christian decency," the legion objection stated. "The treatment, when scenes are further compounded by sensational exploitation, renders the film morally unacceptable in a mass medium of entertainment. The film does not bear a Code Seal of Approval of the United American motion picture industry."

'Golden Bell' Award Presented To NCCM

Pittsburgh (NC)—The Catholic Broadcasters' Association has presented its 1960 Golden Bell Award for the outstanding national television program to the National Council of Catholic Media and Television for the NCCM.

The honored program was "The Decisive Years," produced by the NCCM in cooperation with the CBS-TV network as part of a series on the Catholic Church in American history.
