Said Killed

Vientiane — (RNS) — An Italian Catholic priest who disappeared into the Laos jungle, which is infested with Communist rebels, is feared to have been killed.

He is Father Mario Borzaga, 27, of Trento, Italy, who was working with the Order of Oblates of Mary in Laos at the time.

Last April, Father Borzaga was sent into the jungle accompanied by mountain guides and porters. He was traveling from Sis Kachin, some 50 miles south of Luang Prabang, and was expected back in three days. But neither Father Borzaga nor any members of his party have been heard from.

Beau Catcher  
Fried Chicken

Having a picnic for the 4th of July? Here's a wonderful new recipe from the Home Economics Division of Swift and Company. It's called Beau Catcher Fried Chicken . . . it's irresistible, and I think it's appropriately named. Men will certainly praise you when you serve it.

Everyone loves good fried chicken but when the flavor of the chicken is just a little different, and the crispy coating on the outside is specially seasoned . . . you've a delicacy that merits compliments.

It's easy as can be to prepare this chicken. You can select trying chicken or your favorite pan. Chicken is plentiful and that means the price is right. It is one of the best buys at the present time. Here's the new twist to this wonder fix recipe for fried chicken. First dip each piece of chicken in buttermilk, and then in seasoned flour. The trick lies in the flour: it is some dried, minced onion. After coating the chicken well with the flour it is ready to fry.

MANY HOMEMAKERS shy away from frying on top of the stove. I like the oven-frying method myself. It's so easy and if you're not familiar with it, this is what you do. Melt butter in a shallow pan . . . in a hot oven at 400 degrees. When the butter is melted arrange the pieces of coated chicken in the pan. Do not pile the pieces of chicken on top of each other.

As you arrange the chicken in the pan, with tongs, turn

each piece over so it's covered

with the melted butter. Arrange the chicken skin side down. Place in a hot oven 400 degrees and bake for 30 minutes, then turn the pieces of chicken and bake another 30 minutes or till chicken is fork tender.

Should the guests be a little late, just turn the oven down to about 200 degrees and if necessary brush with a little additional butter.

SERVE THE golden browned, crispy fried chicken in a napkin-lined basket . . . or on a large platter. Add a bow trim to the basket if you like. What bait this is for hungry appetites. To complete the menu for your 4th of July picnic serve corn on the cob, lors of cold sliced red ripe tomatoes, served on a large platter with crispy greens, perfect potato salad, hot rolls, strawberry shortcake and beverages.

Here's the exact recipe for BEAU CATCHER FRIED CHICKEN.

BEAU CATCHER FRIED CHICKEN

Yield: 4 servings  
1 frying chicken, cut up or favorite parts

1 c. buttermilk

1 c. flour

2 t. salt

1/4 t. pepper

2 t. paprika

1/4 t. leaf thyme

3 T. dried minced onion

1/4 c. butter

Dip chicken pieces into buttermilk and then into a mixture of flour, salt, pepper, paprika, thyme, and minced onion. Melt butter in a shallow baking pan in a hot oven 400 degrees. Remove baking pan from oven.

As pieces of floured chicken are placed in pan, turn to coat with butter, then bake skin side down for 30 minutes. Turn chicken. Bake another 30 minutes or till tender.

New York — (NC) — The National Legion of Decency has placed in its condemned classification the semidocumentary movie "Savage Eye," distributed by Trans-Lux Kingsley International.

"The treatment of this semi-documentary film involves blasphemous violation of Jewish-Christian decency," the Legion objected, "This treatment, whose extremes are further compounded by sensational exploitation, renders the film morally unacceptable as a serious medium of entertainment. The film does not receive a Code Seal of Approval of the organization of American motion picture leaders."




