Trained in the rites of idol worship from her early years, Ruth (Elana Eden) now grown graduate—wishes other converts by the high priest, Hadas. Her heart is changed after a vision with the golden Mahlon (Tom Tamm), who tells her about his invisible God. The 132 minute drama unfolds into his violent death, her conversion to Judaism, and the flight with Mahlon's mother, Naomi, to Bethlehem, where she encounters religious persecution and becomes embroiled in a romantic triangle.

VERY HAPPY to state, for a change we have a very good Biblical drama which ignores the customary persecution with sex exhibitionism. And even more happy to announce, from all reports in the trade magazines, this movie is making money which is the language of Hollywood. In the long run good entertainment WILL and MUST win out. Now it's up to us to give our support and see such a top movie.
