Penn Yan Paulist Marks Jubilee

Penn Yan — Touching the heights in a worldly as well as in a spiritual sense has highlighted the priestly life of Father Francis Guy Quinnan, C.S.P., who this week returns to his home parish, St. Michael's, for a Golden Jubilee celebration.

A mountain climber of no mean attainments, he has climbed the Jungfrau, the Mont and the Eiger peaks in Switzerland as well as several of the better-known heights in the U.S. And he has known personally both Pope St. Pius X and St. Francis Xavier Cabrini, R.C.

Washington, D.C. His career in the priesthood reached from Rome, Italy all across the U.S. and embraced fields of activity almost as wide and varied.

The Paulist Fathers' Mission Bands in both New York City and San Francisco had him as a member for several years and together with Father Jerome P. Donegan, C.S.P., he established the first Paulist Mission Band in the great Northwest at Portland, Ore.

For twenty-five years they blazed the trail throughout the woods and wilds as well as the cities of the western states and Canada, giving missions to non-Catholics as well as Catholics. They were the first priests to give radio-lectures on the Faith from the Seattle Cathedral, in 1912.

A TOUR AS PASTOR OF St. Paul the Apostle Church in Westwood, Los Angeles gave him the opportunity to reveal unusual talents in art and architecture. He designed and built the parish school and convent and redecorated the church. His school design attracted wide attention in architectural circles.

He also achieved distinction in Newman Club work, particularly at the University of California at Berkeley and has written a treatise on this work for the guidance of priests engaged in it which has achieved the status of a manual.

Relieving from responsibilities as pastor in 1937 at the age of 74, he has continued to be active in writing, preaching and pastoral work.

He studied at St. Andrew's and St. Bernard's Seminary in this diocese before joining the Paulist Fathers, with whom he finished his training for the priesthood at St. Thomas College at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C.

He was among the first to be elected in the diocese to the position of vicar general of the diocese in 1931. He was elected prior at the provincial chapter of the Washington Province of the order held June 21.

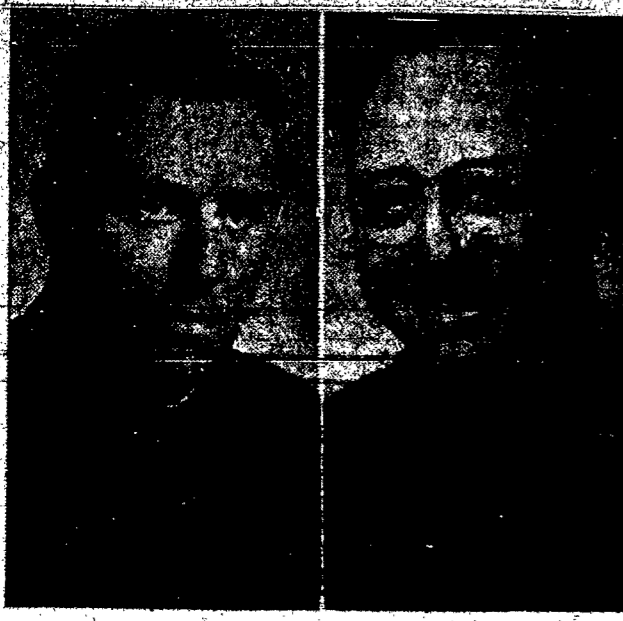

Basilian Fathers Given New Posts

The Rev. Frederick H. Sohn, C.S.B., a member of the teaching staff of Aquinas Institute, has been appointed treasurer of the Basilian Fathers' school, according to the Very Rev. George P. Flahiff, C.S.B., superior-general.

FATHER SOHN succeeds the Rev. Vincent C. Eckert, C.S.B., treasurer for the past fifteen years.

FATHER ECKERT will assume the post of treasurer in September at the new Andean High School in Gary, Indiana, a co-institutional school of 1500 students.

Under Father Eckert's direction Aquinas Institute has been completely refurbished and additional classroom space provided to meet the demands of increased enrollment. In 1938 he procured use of School 40 from the Rochester Board of Education. After considerable renovation the school, known as the Aquinas Annex, opened its doors to 570 freshmen.

The combined schools listed a population of over 1100 students. With the opening of the Aquinas Annex, the largest privately owned high school stadium in the country.

In 1940 the Aquinas Memorial Stadium was completed under the direction of Father Eckert. Since its opening he has served as director of the half-million dollar structure, the largest privately owned high school stadium in the country.

FATHER SOHN is the son of Mrs. Frederick H. Sohn of 425 Remington St. and the late Mr. Sohn. He attended Our Lady of Perpetual Help grammar school and Aquinas Institute. He was awarded a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Toronto, a bachelor of theology degree from the University of St. Michael's College and a master of education degree from the University of Rochester.

Other changes in the Aquinas faculty include: Father Vincent J. Fullerton, C.S.B., head of the Spanish department and moderator of the Mothers' Club; Father Charles J. Brindley, C.S.B., and Father Edwin J. Kline, C.S.B. Father Fullerton will join the Basilian Fathers' Mexican Mission band as a missionary to the Spanish speaking people of Texas. Father holds the title of Community Procurator of the Basilian Fathers. Father Brindley will return to France as a member of the faculty of Sacred Heart College, Amnony. Father Kline will join Father Eckert on the faculty of Andean.

SCHOLASTICS' appointments are as follows: Mr. David Kelly, an Aquinas graduate and member of the faculty for two years to Michael Power High School, Toronto; Mr. Richard Alford to Catholic Central, Detroit; and the following to complete their theological course at St. Basil's Seminary, Toronto: Alfred Graham, Eugene Bammel, Donald Kuder, William Lee and Joseph Quinnan.
