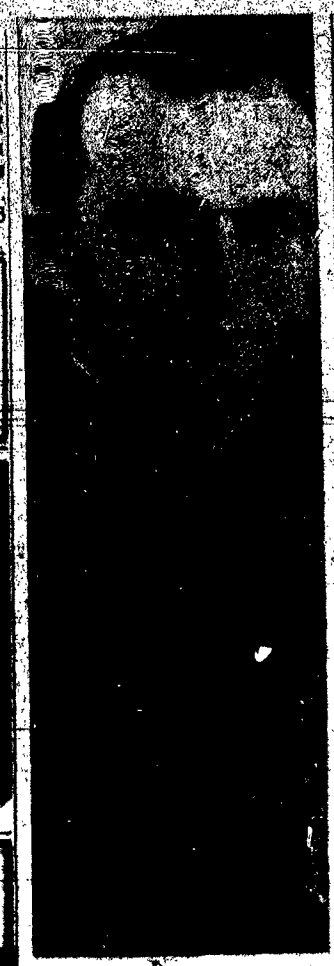

Dr. Karpinski becomes the first Eagle Scout to be elected to the presidency of the Council.

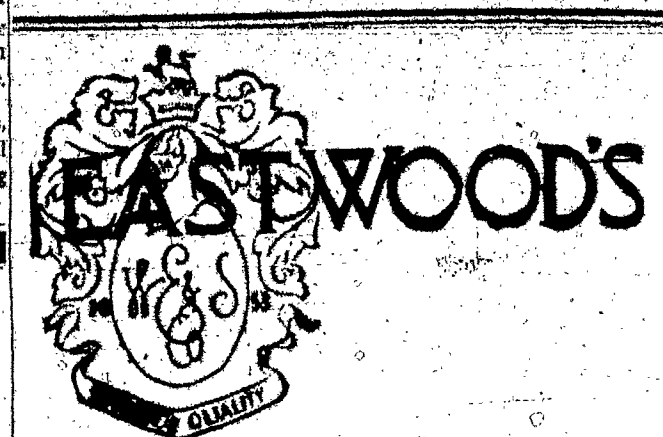
