Basilian Fathers Given New Posts

The Rev. Frederick H. Sohn, C.S.B., a member of the teaching staff of Aquinas Institute, has been appointed treasurer of the Basilian Fathers' school, according to the Rev. George P. Flahiff, C.S.B., superior-general.

Father Sohn succeeds the Rev. Vincent E. Eckert, C.S.B., who was treasurer for the past fifteen years.

FATHER ECKERT will assume the post of treasurer of the Aquinas Institute, which is located at the new Aquinas High School in Gary, Indiana, a co-educational school of 1500 students.

Under Father Eckert's direction Aquinas Institute has been completely refurnished and additional classroom space provided to meet the demands of increased enrollment. In 1948 he procured use of School 40 from the Rochester Board of Education. After considerable renovation the school, known as the Aquinas Annex, opened its doors to 370 freshmen.

The combined schools listed a population of over 1700 students. With the opening of the Aquinas Annex, the school has an increased public school enrollment. The Annex was returned to the Board of Education in 1952.

In 1949 the Aquinas Memorial Stadium was completed under the direction of Father Eckert. Since its opening he has served as director of the half-million dollar structure, the largest privately owned high school stadium in the country.

FATHER SOHN is the son of Mrs. Frederick H. Sohn of 425 Remington St. and the late Mr. Sohn. He attended Our Lady of Perpetual Help grammar school and Aquinas Institute. He was awarded a bachelor of arts degree from the University of Toronto, a bachelor of theology degree from the University of St. Michael's College and a master of education degree from the University of Rochester.

Other changes in the Aquinas faculty include Father Vincent J. Kullerton, C.S.B., head of the Spanish department and moderator of the Mothers' Club; Father Charles J. Principe, C.S.B., and Father Edwin J. Kline, C.S.B., who will join the Basilian Fathers' Mexican Mission based at a mission to the Spanish speaking people of Texas. Father will take the title of Community Procurator of the Missions. Father Principe will return to France as a member of the faculty of Sacred Heart College, Annony. Father Kline will join Father Eckert on the faculty of Andean High School, Gary, Indiana.

Grand Knight James Bothe, who was in charge of the event, introduced each couple to the group attending and welcomed the dance was arranged.

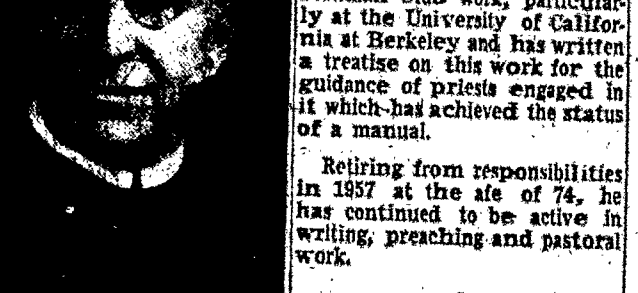
Mountain Climber Penn Yan Paulist Marks Jubilee

Penn Yan — Touching the heights in a worldly as well as in a spiritual sense has highlighted the priestly life of Father Francis Guy Quinn, C.S.P., who this week returns to his home parish, St. Michael's, for a Golden Jubilee celebration.

A mountain-climber of no mean attainments, he has climbed the Jungfrau, the Mont Blanc and the Elger peaks in Switzerland as well as several of the better-known heights in the U.S. And he has known personally both Pope St. Pius X and St. Francis Xavier Cabrini. He

also achieved distinction in Newman Club work, particularly at Berkeley and has written a book on this work for the guidance of priests engaged in it which has achieved the status of a manual.

Retiring from responsibilities in 1957 at the age of 74, he has continued to be active in writing, preaching and pastoral work.

He knew the sainted Pope during a tour of duty in Rome and Mother Cabrini in connection with work in Portland, Ore.

Born here on June 6, 1883 to Bartholomew Quinn and Margaret Manley Quinn, he celebrated his first Mass in the parish church of St. Michael in June, 1910, after his ordination by James Cardinal Gibbons. His Jubilee Mass will be offered on Sunday, July 10 at 12 noon.

HE STUDIED AT St. Andrews and St. Bernard's Sem. John Swinko, J. P. Nelson, joining the Paulist Fathers, with whom he finished his training for the priesthood at St. Thomas College at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C. His career in the priesthood reached from Rome, Italy all across the U.S. and embraced fields of activity almost as wide and varied.

The Paulist Fathers' Mission Bands in both New York City and San Francisco had him as a member for several years and together with Father Jerome P. Donagan, C.S.P., he established the first Paulist Mission Band on the West Coast at Port Angeles, Washington.

For twenty years he has been the spiritual director of the Paulist Fathers' Mission Bands in the West Coast of the United States and in other parts of the world.

Elmira Agency Finds Homes For Children

This is the first of a series of articles describing the work of Catholic Family Service of Elmira in marital problems, teenage needs, adoptions, foster homes and unmarried girls facing motherhood.

These are a few of the many phases of their work which helped 3,016 men, women and children in all types of service last year.

All information was obtained through the agency, its case workers and Miss Mary E. Fitzgerald, executive director.

"We become foster parents serious reason must suffer to have a companion for our only child and now we'd like to take them all," says Mr. and Mrs. Gerald M. Stull, Elmira, expressing the joy and happiness which is their reward for caring for their foster children.

Children are temporarily or permanently deprived of parental care for many reasons, most of which are not their fault. There is no substitute for the love and understanding which all children need and can find through their own parents in their own homes.

However, there are certain situations such as serious illness, physical, emotional or moral neglect and marital problems which temporarily deprive some boys and girls of their natural home.

Catholic Family Service of Elmira is a non-profit, non-sectarian agency which provides a variety of services to children and their families.

A child's world can seem confusing to him when he is moved from one family group to another. Such a child needs more acceptance, patience, love, religiously and socially sound living with their own parents in order to become a responsible, self-reliant adult.
