

Civil War Centenary To Begin In 1961

Washington — (RNS) — The Civil War Centennial Commission announced here that 25,000 copies of a booklet designed to enlist the cooperation of American churches in observance of its five-year centennial program are being mailed out to leaders of all religious groups.

Entitled "The Role of Religion in the Civil War Centennial," the booklet offers a list of suggested centennial activities for religious organizations, both clergy and lay.

Churches will initially be asked to focus their attention on special programs for Sunday, January 8, 1961, when the formal observance of the centennial will begin.
