Watching The Screen
Spaghetti Racket

What a title! What does it mean? Well, for those who have gone to the Loew's Theatre to see "THE APARTMENT," they will know what it means. For those ADULTS ONLY who haven't, you can either take yourself to see it, or, dread the thought, read on in this article.
The story is simple. Jack Lemmon is a lonely insurance clerk with a convenient apartment which has become the rendezvous-point for five of his bosses and their amours. In return, he's promoted from his 19th floor office to a 27th wood-paneled office complete with key to the executive washroom. Shirley Maclaine, an elevator girl, plays the Juliet to Romeo Fred MacMurray. When Lemmon falls in love with Shirley, he turns in his key to top executive Fred and all that goes with it in exchange for her.
"APARTMENT" is all Lemmon. He receives top billing and rightly deserves it. His delineation of an amiable snook whom everybody pushes around is flawless, possibly, I think, the best characterization he has to date delivered. The best lesson taught in this 125 minute film is how to strain spaghetti if you don't have a colander. As does Jack, simply get a tennis racket and pour the pan over it. It works perfectly.
Fred MacMurray is wasted in this film. He seems to be completely out of character. Maybe it's because he's remembered too well for his part in the very enjoyable comedy, "The Slaggy Dog." Anyhow, I think he could have found someone better to play an unmitigated heel.
Possibly this reviewer was more on the dull side than usual on the evening of the preview as I couldn't see the humor in this subtle "humor" satire. In fact, I think it's too filled with overtones of sex and suggestiveness to say it's a good comedy to be seen by many. To tell you the truth, if it wasn't for another movie I wanted to see following this one, I would have walked out. Other review-

The newest album in this field is "The Music Of Victor Herbert" by George Melachrino and his Orchestra on RCA. Victor Melachrino is a wizard of an arranger. He does justice to old Victor keeping the true essence of the old operetta but giving it just the right sparkle to keep it alive. Some of the famous songs on the album are "Ah, Sweet Mystery Of Life," "March Of The Toys," "Gypsy Love Song," "I'm Falling In Love With Someone," "Italian Street Song," "Sweetheart," "Kiss Me Again," "Tina Tina" and "A Kiss In The Dark."

ROCHESTER'S Alec Wilder has composed the sound track music for the new movie "The Sand Castle" which Columbia has just released in album form. "The Sand Castle" is the story of an afternoon in a boy's life. It is a double film. What occurs in his waking consciousness is filmed in black and white and what he dreams is in color. His mother sends him in charge of his little sister on a beach, telling them that she will return later.
When he tries to join in the water games of the other boys, he is driven off and told to go and build his own fort. Rejected, he wanders down the beach, picking up strange objects which wash up at his feet. This leads him to decide to build a sand castle. Eventually, the usual holiday crowd gathers to watch him, a dozen or more of the most unlikely people are affected, directly or indirectly by what he is doing. In a sense their destinies are either confirmed or reversed. A sudden rain storm drives everyone from the beach except the boy and his sister. Under an umbrella which has been given to them to protect the castle they lie down to wait their mother. The boy falls asleep.
In his dream, he explores the interior of the castle, here he meets the people that had surrounded him while he was building. He picks up the threads of their problems as he understands them and dreams them through to his own conclusion. Just before his mother awakens him, he learns the secret of the power of his creation. The castle, of course, is washed back into the sea.

This laugh romp, which deals with the alchemy of a professor in post-war Washington and the dumb ex-chorine he has brought along, has been directed by Dorothy Chernack.

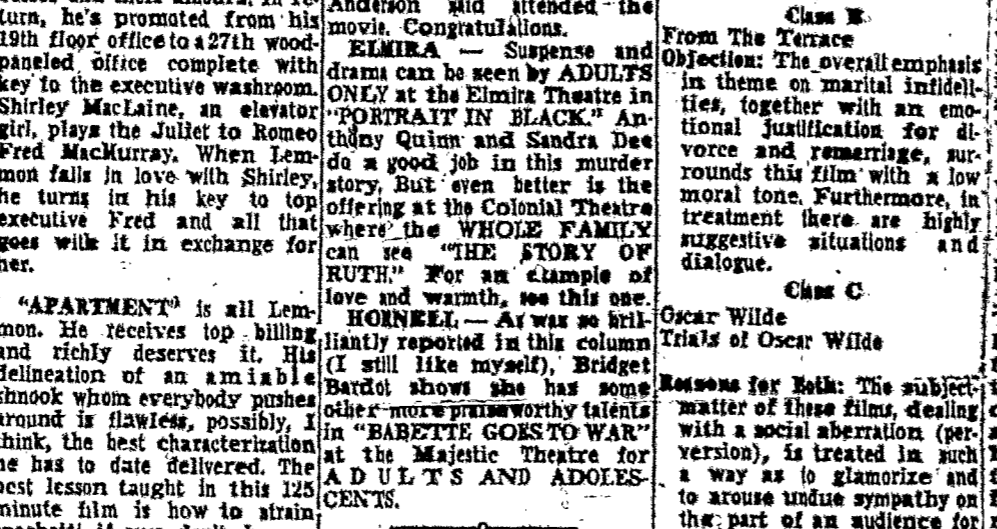
