Looking Back Old Cathedral Photos Set Memory In Motion

When a call was made on Father Leo C. Mooney, relired pastor of St. Patrick's Church the other day I noticed pictures of old St. Patrick's Cathedral on the walls of the rectory recepion room at 151 Saratoga Ave. Having started life before the turn of the century in the old Cathedral parish the pictures set memories in motion.

Sermons by such orators as Bishop McFadden of Cleve-land at the National Council of Catholic Men opening Mass and Father Mooney of the Bulfalo diocese were long remember ed by those who attended.
