Batavia Downs, which introduced night harness racing to this area in 1940, unveils its 19th season Monday with the opening of an 81 night meet.

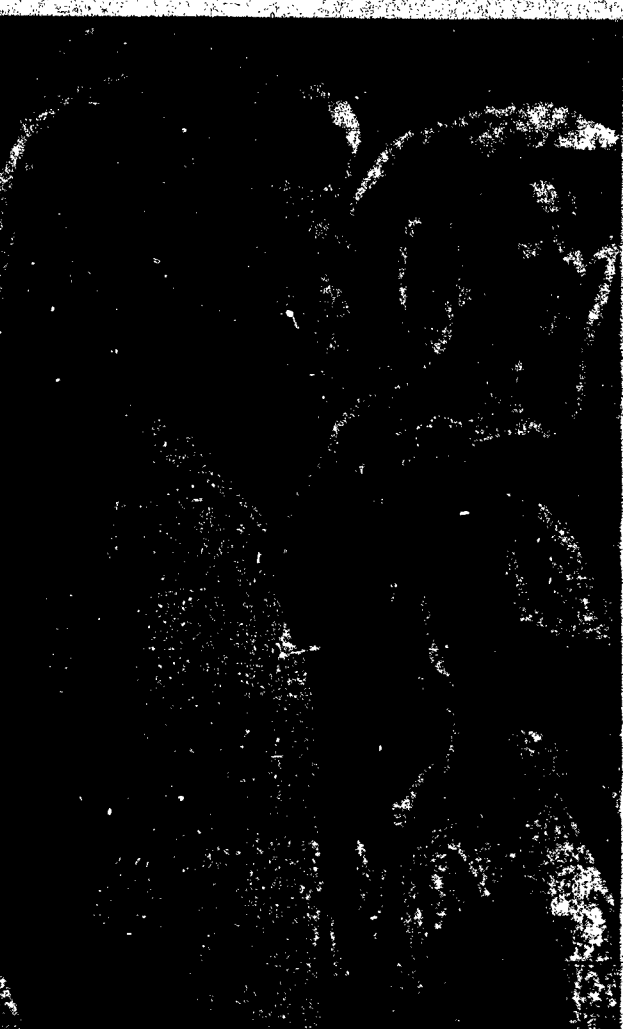

Buffalo Raceway Season Closes

Fitting for the close of a successful harness racing meeting, Buffalo Raceway will present Championship events on the two final nights, July 22, and July 23. The first of these, the \$7500 Championship Trot, is open to all horses.

Proceeding the weekend feature on Thursday night, Rayna, Buffalo Raceway will present the nation's top vocalists and oldies Memorial State No. 1 will made them sound just a bit better. Decca has just released an album of the piano stylings of this fine artist. Ellis prepared this album himself. He employs a "string" quartet, on piano and a rhythm section.

REG OWEN of "Manhattan Spiritual" fame has released a new album called "Hypnotic Swing" on Laitella label. This collection of swingers has more bounce and pop than a flock of new-horn pups. Reg has given his distinctive musical touch to such exciting members as "Manhattan Spiritual," "Down By The Riverside," "Swing Low, Sweet Chariot," "Swallowtail Birdland" and many others.

THE STRAUSS waits is probably the most recorded music in the music business. Antal Dorati, conductor of the Philadelphia Orchestra, decided to give a few other waiters a crack at the wait loving public. In this new album on Mercury called "Newswater Paprika" are contained six great waiters which were not written by Johann Strauss, Jr. But the album does contain "The Merry Widow Waltz" by Franz Lehár, "The Gypsy Princess Waltz" by Emmerich Kalman, "Village Waltz" from Austria Waltz by Josef Strauss (brother of Johann, Jr.), "Wedding Waltz" from "Pierrotte's Veil" by Erno Dohnanyi, "The Skaters Waltz" by Emil Waldteufel and "The Schottische" by Josef Lanner.

Dorati conducts the waiters at a nice bright clip so that they don't drag and begin sounding backwood as so many Strauss waiters do. Even the "Skaters Waltz" which has been ruined for most people by a past-time organ of a roller-skating rink and a cheap piano. An interesting note about "The Merry Widow Waltz" is the fact that its composer Josef Lanner is the real inventor of the Viennese waltz.

Lanner, a self-taught violinist headed his own trio by the time he reached the age of sixteen. Later he enlarged his trio to a quartet by hiring another violinist named Johann Strauss (the older, father of Junior) and the first chapter in the fabulous history of the Waltz was underway.
