needs. Teenager counseling no such thing as a bad boy," seeks to help the parent and child to understand each other and themselves.

Many teen-agers, or "young adults" as Miss Dwyer calls them, who come to the agency seem to lack the proper training which gives them a standard of living which is acceptable to the community. Miss Dwyer works with the family and every effort is made to remedy the home situation and to establish a warm parent-child relationship.

AN IMPORTANT factor for maladjusted and delinquent children are family circumstances such as broken homes. Surviving the home environment will determine whether the child stays in the home or is removed to a foster home or to an institution. Institutional placements include mental

There has been a 95% increase in the last year in teen-age counseling. During one month's time this year, Miss Dwyer had 42 teen-age cases. Some of these are referred by the Youth Bureau, the children's court, the schools, pastors or families.

Some of these young adults come from fine Christian homes and good Catholic parents but most of these troubled young men and women have been deprived of their natural rights of love, security and religious training. Each one needs an abundance of kindness, patience and understanding. They need above all a sound faith in their counselor and new friend. Many of these "young adults" are easy to reach but others do not respond so quickly. Miss Dwyer has unlimited patience and boundless understanding, even under the temptation to give up. She is fully agreeable, however, with the responsibilities to their spouse and families. They should also assume the responsibility, morally and physically for their children.
