Blessing at the grave in Holy Sepulchre Cemetery was imparted by Father William Hart.

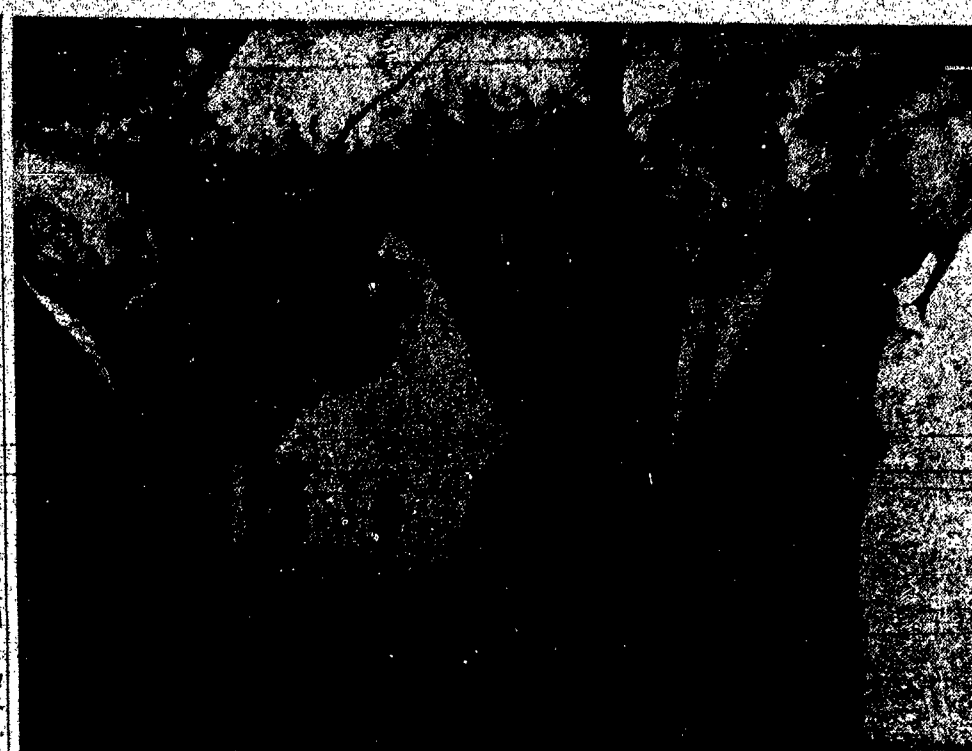
