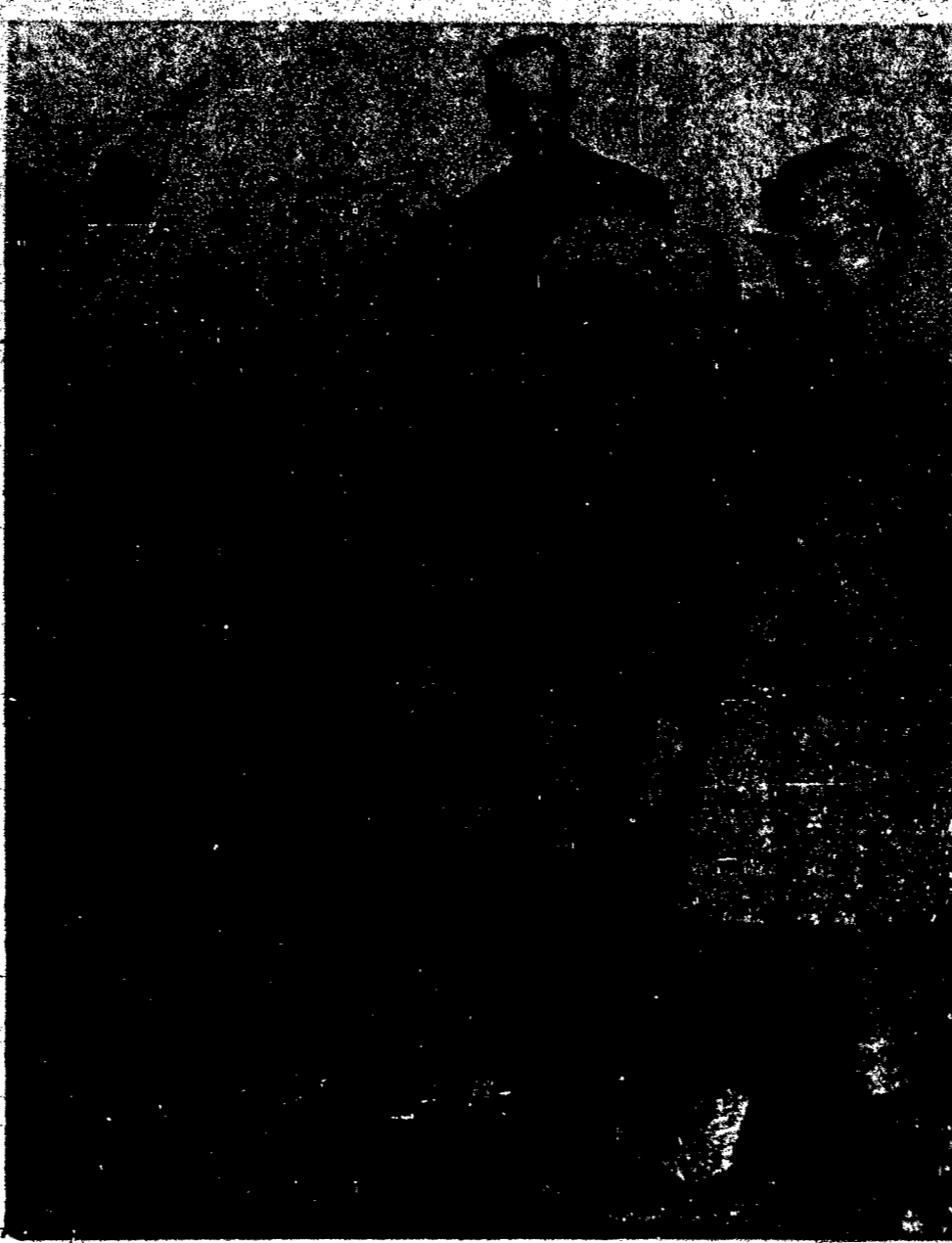
Enviably Record

Students in diocesan high schools have retained an enviable record in the June 7-10 Regents tests.

A comparison between Rochester area Catholic and public schools in the tests revealed the following per centage of success:

In Biology — public school pupils, 82 per cent passed; diocesan school pupils, 83 per cent passed; Physics — public schools, 87 per cent passed; diocesan schools, 84 per cent; English 4 — public schools, 86 per cent; diocesan schools, 87 per cent; Algebra — public schools, 85 per cent; diocesan schools, 84 per cent; World History — public schools, 86 per cent; diocesan schools, 86 per cent; American History — public schools, 76 per cent; diocesan schools, 81 per cent.

In Chemistry, public school pupils had an 82 per cent success, diocesan pupils an 80 per cent success.

Bob Dove, College All American from Notre Dame and line coach of the Bills, is high in his praise of Gene Grabosky, 278 pound lineman from Syracuse National Championship team of last year.

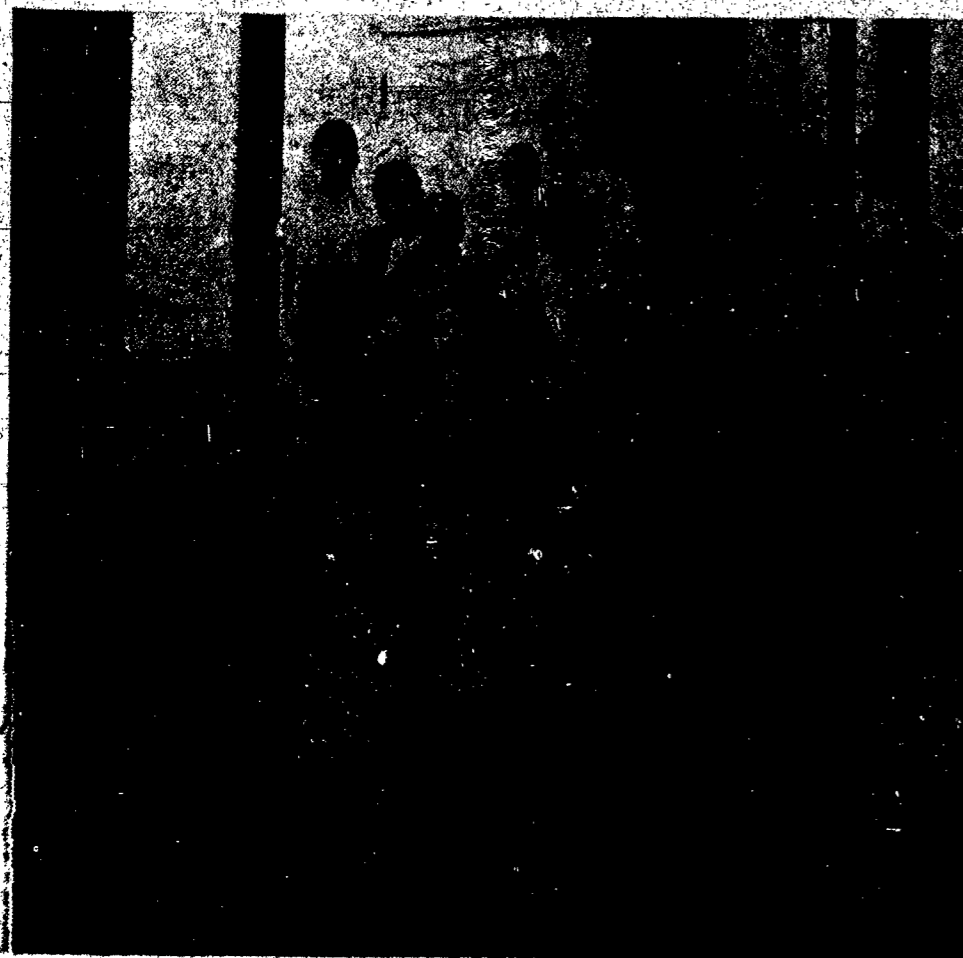
Two Deanery Moderators
