

State Aide Praises Diocesan - Run Camp

A state leader's approval was given Camp Stella Maris, diocesan summer camp for boys and girls on Copenus Lake, it was learned at the camp, this week.

Hobart J. Davern of the New York State Conservation Department described Camp Stella Maris as "the best I have seen" after a visit there. An instructor for the Education and Safety Division, Davern conducted an instructor's course for Motor Boat safety at the diocesan camp. Staff members of three summer camps, Livingston County Sheriff's deputies and several lake residents were certified as instructors.

THE STATE AID was high in his praise of the Stella Maris waterfront. With more than 400 feet of dock supported by adjustable pipe standards, the waterfront has three separate swimming areas, each

with its own "buddy board" and life guards.

Each morning three swimming classes of 40 minutes each are conducted for the entire camp with a ratio of eight campers for each instructor. Recreational or "free" swimming is held every afternoon for an hour.

Water skiing was introduced this summer for the advanced swimmers. All campers are given the opportunity to pass Red Cross tests and to earn their swimming cards.

JOHN GYOMPOR of St. Bernard's Seminary in Waterfront Director assisted by a staff of Red Cross life guards, Daniel Holland of St. Bernard's attended the N.C.C.A. water safety school at Cathedral Camp, Massachusetts.

The new boat house on the beach serves as an office for Red Cross records and buddy boards and a storeroom for the cars and paddles for the 9 row-boats and 2 canoes.

Davern who has visited many camps throughout New York State gave Stella Maris a high rating for its complete waterfront equipment and its fine facilities for teaching swimming.
