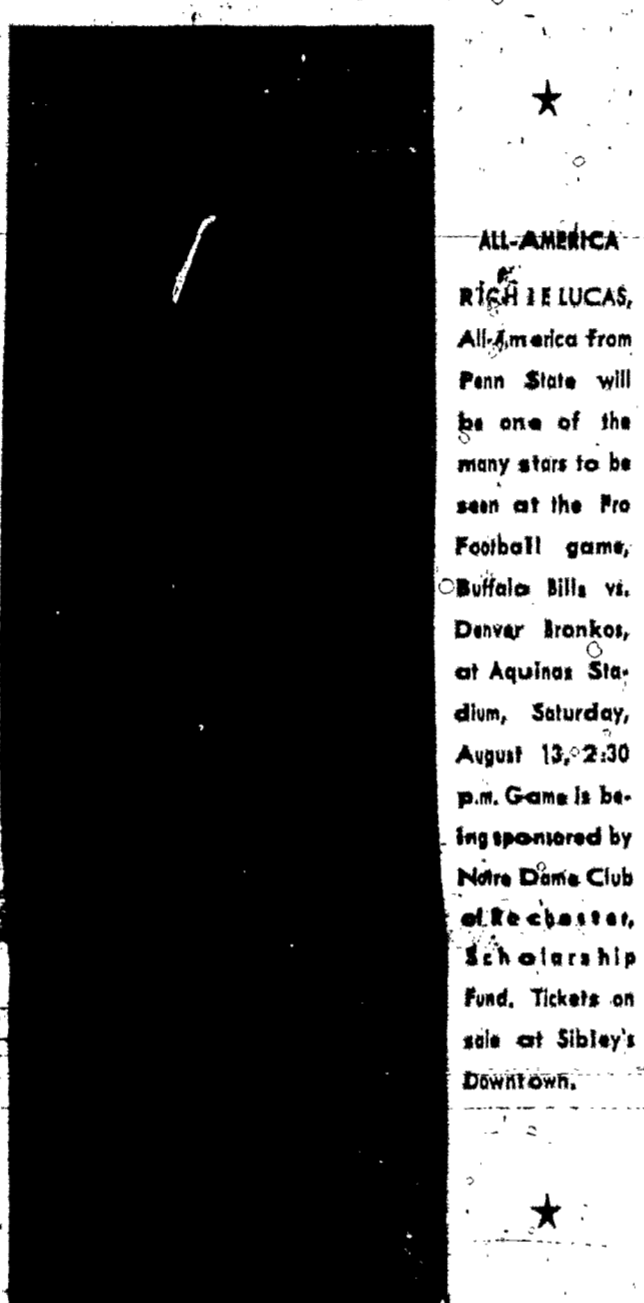

Reds Block Travel To Eucharistic Congress

Berlin — (RNS) — Last minute efforts to persuade Soviet Zone authorities to grant travel permits to East German Catholics so they could attend the 27th International Eucharistic Congress at Munich ended in failure, Julius Cardinal Doepfner, Bishop of Berlin announced.

He made the announcement in a pastoral letter to the Soviet Zone clergy which was quoted in a West Berlin Radio broadcast.

THE CARDINAL said negotiations were conducted between Church spokesmen and officials of the East German State Office for Church Affairs in the hope of permits being granted at least to a group of representative East German Catholics, but "no common basis of agreement could be found."

Cardinal Doepfner was reported as saying that the East Berlin faithful could apply individually for a special pass to attend the Eucharistic Congress. However, the West Berlin station commented that "there remains hardly any prospect of Catholics in the Soviet Zone attending the event."

Observers here noted that, meanwhile, the East German Radio had renewed cautions to Catholics in the Communist-ruled territory against taking part in the congress.

Catacombs in India

New Delhi — (RNS) — A large number of catacombs — the only subterranean structures of their kind in India — have been discovered at Agrah some 120 miles from New Delhi under a church built by the Sultan Akbar for his wife Miriam more than 400 years ago.

The church is near the Taj Mahal and, like the world famous monument, was constructed by Italian and Indian craftsmen. The catacombs were believed burrowed by Mirza Zul-karnain, a controversial figure in Indian medieval history.

Historians say Zul-karnain built the catacombs to hide escaped Christian slave workers during the reign of Shah Jehan, the builder of the Taj Mahal.

Young Nuns From Moscow

Jerusalem — (RNS) — Five young nuns, all in their 20s, arrived here from Moscow to join the five convents belonging to the Russian Orthodox Church mission in Jerusalem. This meant increasing the number of Russian nuns here to 20.

The nuns, it was explained, were sent here because most of the Russian nuns in Jerusalem are "very old" and some of them have been here since the time of the Czar.

Ministers Doubt Their Doctrine

Milwaukee — (NC) — Thirty-eight per cent of the Episcopal Bishops' Virginity survey disbelieve or doubt the doctrine of the virgin birth of Christ.

Of 544 ministers replying to the survey, 227 per cent said they do believe in the doctrine of the virgin birth.

The Catholic Church teaches as a dogma that the Blessed Virgin remained a virgin before, during and after the conception and birth of Christ, and that she was His only human parent.

Episcopal ministers are required before they are ordained to accept in writing the statement that Christ was "born of the Virgin Mary."

The survey was conducted by the Living Church, an Episcopal magazine published here. The magazine published a questionnaire — based on the Catholic Church's doctrine about Mary — to every seventh minister on the Episcopal Church's list of U. S. Clergy. Replies were returned by 1,363 ministers.

IN OTHER findings, the survey showed:

That 246 of the 544 ministers

believe in the doctrine of the Immaculate Conception — that Mary "in the first instant of her conception was preserved immune from all stain of original sin."

The Catholic Church teaches that the Blessed Virgin remained a virgin throughout her life. The dogma of the Assumption, formally defined by Pope Pius XII in 1950, states that the soul and body of the Blessed Virgin were taken into heaven at the completion of her life on earth. The doctrine of the Immaculate Conception — Mary's preservation from original sin — was proclaimed by Pope Pius IX in 1854.

Nazareth Grads Gain Masters

Three graduates of Nazareth College were awarded Master's degrees at the recent commencement of the University of Rochester. Mrs. Alice Dean Comerford, 11 Portsmouth Terrace, who received her Bachelor of Arts degree at Nazareth, was given the degree of Master of Education, as was Mrs. Marguerite Knapp Schmitt, 300 Alpine Drive. Mr. Schmitt holds a Bachelor of Science degree from Nazareth.

The degree of Master of Science in Industrial Statistics was awarded to Miss Rose Mary Marcie, 582 Seneca Avenue, Bachelor of Arts from Nazareth College.

Auburn Youth Awarded Grant In Engineering

This scholarship is intended for boys and girls who plan to study engineering or who plan to specialize in mathematics, physics or chemistry in college. There are 1,000 scholarships awarded annually, 500 to residents of the counties of New York City and 500 to the residents of all the other counties of the State.

Each scholarship carries a stipend of \$300 to \$850 a year depending on financial need, for each year of study in an approved program in engineering, mathematics, physics or chemistry at any accredited college or university within New York State.

Joseph plans to enter Fordham University in September.
