

Brother Visits Jailed Bishop

Hong Kong — (RNS) — Judge William Walsh of Cumberland, Md., paid two visits to his brother, Maryknoll Bishop James E. Walsh, in the Shanghai jail where the latter is serving a 20-year sentence for alleged espionage against the Chinese Communist regime.

The two brothers took place on Aug. 4 and lasted two hours and the second which was an hour long, occurred on Aug. 8.

According to a British news dispatch from Shanghai, Judge Walsh reported after the second visit that he had a "very nice talk" with his brother and found him feeling quite well and seemingly cheerful. Conversations at both meetings, the judge was quoted as saying, were confined by orders of the prison officials to "family matters."

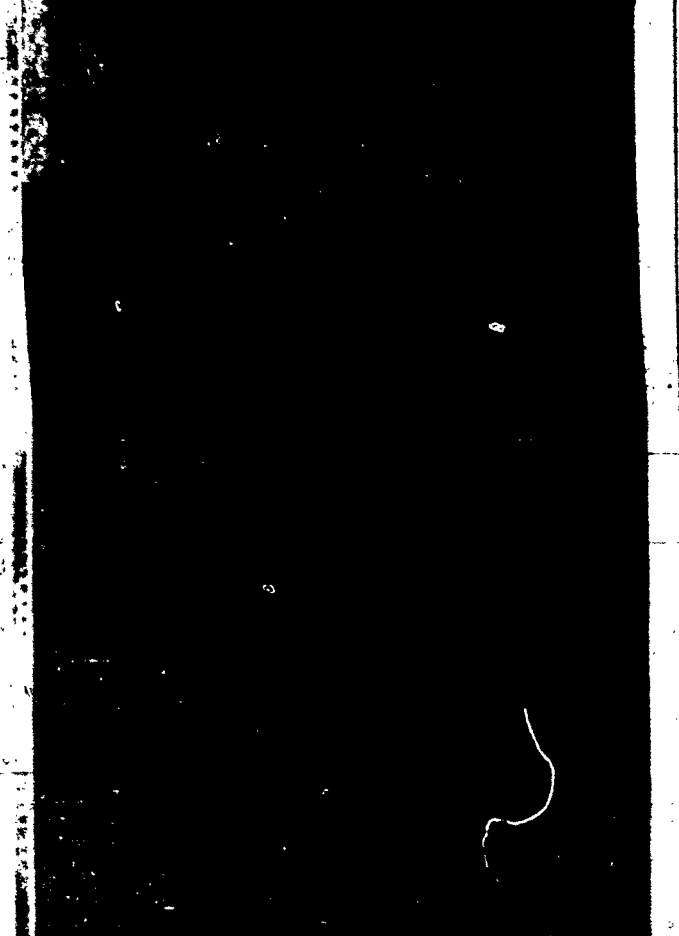
Judge Walsh, 70, arrived in Shanghai on Aug. 3 with a two-week visa granted by the Peiping regime at the urging of the American Red Cross. The meetings with his brother, who is a year younger, took place in a small room of the Shanghai jail with an official Communist interpreter present.

"My brother was pleased to see me, that's for certain," the judge was reported in the British dispatch as stating. "I have no intentions of asking Chinese officials any favors. I've done so and I'm very grateful to the Chinese authorities for their help. The judge brought several bags of clothing with him, as well as other personal supplies for his brother, who told him he had been receiving monthly Red Cross packages sent through Hong Kong.

According to the British dispatch, Bishop Walsh does not say Mass in the prison. It was expected that his sentences will be light, since the bishop pleaded on their behalf, saying they were "misguided."

The accused were alleged to have crowded into the mission house to threaten the White Fathers in charge there with leaving Sir Robert instead of Dr. Hastings Banda, a well-known native leader.

After their apology to Bishop Fedy, the trial of the six natives was adjourned. It is expected that their sentences will be light, since the bishop pleaded on their behalf, saying they were "misguided."

Red Rockets Disrupt Rites

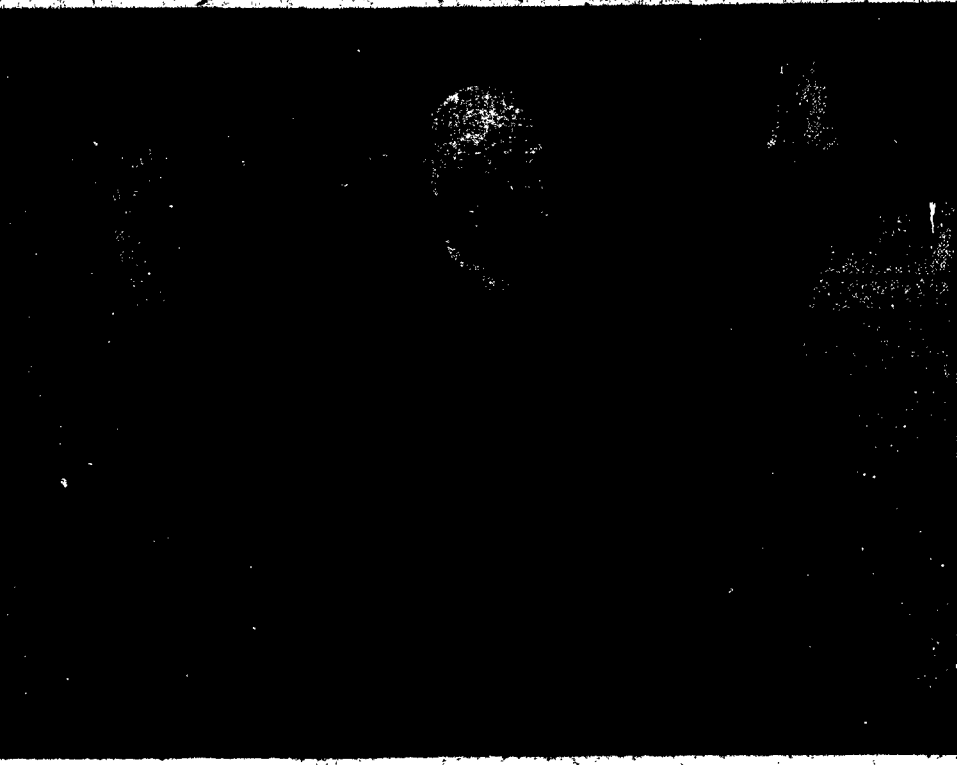

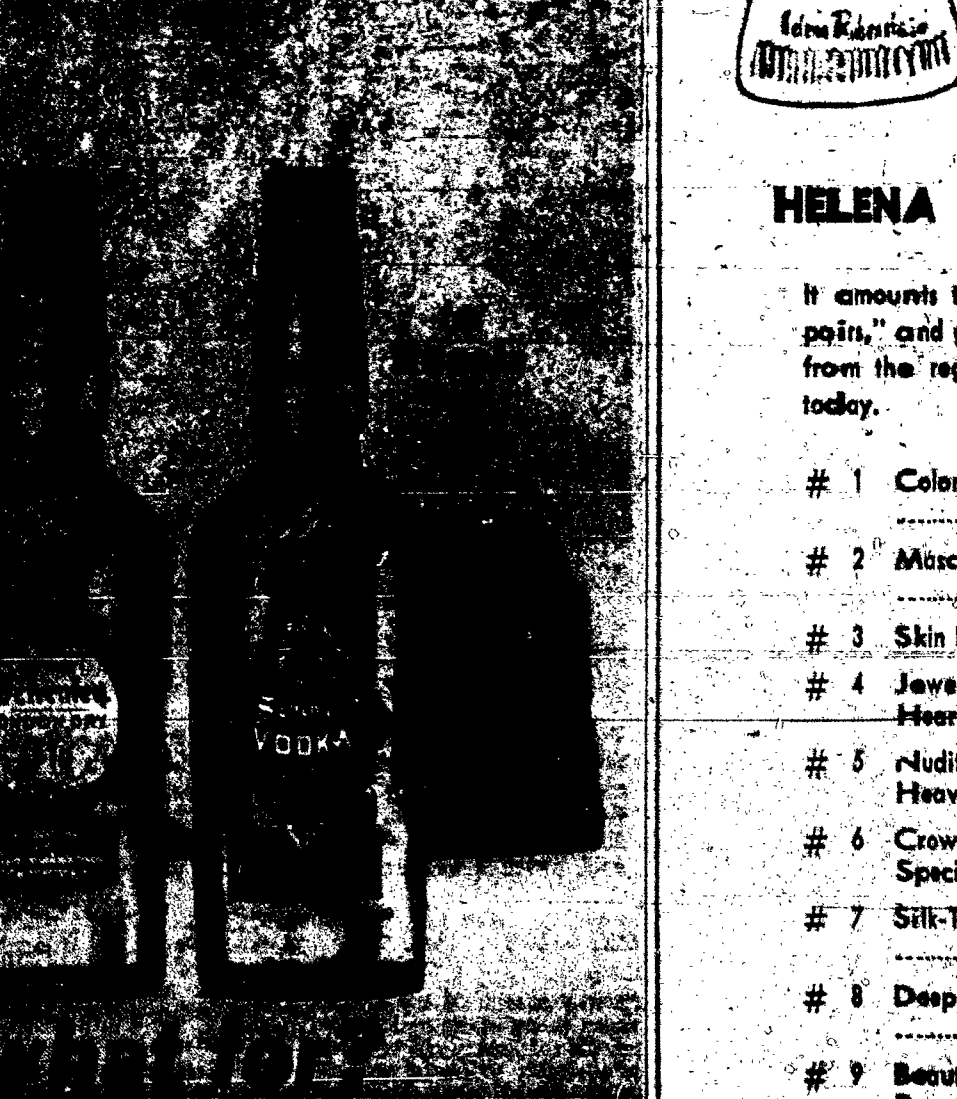

Catholic Schools Face Brush Off

Catholic schools can expect a quick brush-off from a Congress anxious to end its sessions in favor of political campaigning.

Both Democrats and Republicans adopted platform planks calling for federal aid to education but Catholic schools stand little chance of sharing in the program.
