But the power and influence of a Canadian Prirne Minister are real and vital to his country.

During the 26 of the #3 years of her nationhood since Confederation in 1867-Canada has entrusted the leadership of her country to three Catholic Prime Ministers. They have held office in times of peace and intermanames are inscribed in Canada's bistory as great leaders who have contributed in very large measure to national development and prestige.

Both the Conservative and Liberal parties have had two Catholic leaders. Three of the four became Prime Ministers. one a Conservative and awo

Sir John Thompson, Con-servative, who led the goverament from December 5, 1892, until his sudden death on December 12, 1894;

Sir Wilfrid Laurier, Liberal, who was Prime Minister from July 11, 1896, until October 6, 1911:

Rt. Hom. Louis Stephen St. Laurent, Liberal, who was Prime Minister from Novem-ber 15, 1948, until June 21,

Mon. Br. Richard J. Manien in leader of the Conserva-tive city in 1938-40, but failed to attain the Prime Ministership because his party was unable during that time to gain sufficient support from the Consdian electorate.

There was one period -1892-94 - when Canada's two major political parties were headed by Catholics, Sir John Chompson as Conservative Prime Minister and Wilfrid Laurier as leader of the Lib-eral party then the Official Opposition.

The position of Governor General of Canada — the direct representative of the Queen as ceremonial head of State - is not directly dependent on the electorate, but the incumbent is named by the reigning monarch on the recommendation of the Caradian government in power. Today the Governor General of Canada is Maj. Gen. George P. Vanier, a Catholic.

Canada has had her growing pains in religious tolerce but few Canadians today would dare to claim that the nation's highest honors should be withheld from a ma-tional leader on the ground that he is a Catholic. The mai admirience under Callao of progress, develop
