Mother Gannon New Superior At Cenacle

The Religious of the Cenacle, who provide retreats for women at the Cenacle Retreat House on East Avenue, welcomed last week their new Superior in the person of Mother Blanche Gannon.

Reverend Mother Gannon received the assignment while stationed in the Florida Cenacle at Manaylan, where she was a pioneer member of the Community when the house was opened last November.

A NATIVE OF Brooklyn, the new superior spent twenty-five years of her religious life in the American Novitiate House of the congregation, located in Lake Ronkonkoma, Long Island.

Reverend Mother Connolly, whom Mother Gannon replaces, was Superior of the Rochester Cenacle for six years. She now holds that office in the Cenacle at Middletown, Connecticut.

It was during her term in Rochester that a large chapel and wing were constructed to provide more convenient facilities for the retreatants.

New Building Ready

For Opening Of School

Corning—When students of St. Mary's Parochial School report for class on Wednesday, Sept. 7, they will be using for the first time the full facilities of the new educational building.

All work on the current building project is complete with the exception of making closures of cracks over the windows and washing the windows according to announcement by Eugene C. Manning, general contractor.

NO DATE FOR formal acceptance of the building by the parish has been set, although Manning reported that it is expected to take place within the next week or 10 days. The acceptance date, the Rev. Thomas J. Brennan, parochial pastor explained, will depend upon the recommendation of the architect, Conidine & Haskell of Elmira.

Furniture for the school is in order and is expected to be delivered also within a week. Father Brennan explained that it was not considered desirable to have it delivered before it could be installed.

No date for the dedication of the building will be established until after the opening of school, Father Brennan said. The date will depend on the schedule of Bishop Kearney.

THE BUILDING furnishes an eight-room L-shaped wing with quarters for 120 additional pupils. It has been built on the site of the school's oldest building, which was razed to make room for the new wing.

The first phase of the project, the remodeling of the north building of the school, was completed last summer.
