**THE NATIONAL** center would strengthen cooperation between European bureaus and the catechetical movement abroad, among catechetical surveys and study meetings, and issue various publications, the resolution said.

It also urged the formation of special catechetical bureaus in every diocese to supervise catechetical work. It said this would secure better cooperation among those active in the apostolate and help to provide them with necessary materials.

The resolution recommended that modern psychology be applied in developing new forms of religious instruction.

At the same time it stressed the great catechetical importance of the Mass and other liturgical rite, which, it said, should be celebrated in such a way that the congregation can understand what is taking place and play an active part.

## Experts Chart Progress in Catechism Teaching

Eichstaett (RNS) — Establishment of national catechetical centers in every country, with a special view to mission requirements, was urged in a resolution approved here by some 200 Roman Catholic bishops, delegates from missionary societies and outstanding ecclesiastical experts from many countries.

Adoption of the resolution came at the close of an International Study Week for Mission Catechists sponsored by the Institute of Mission Apostolates in Manila, Philippine Islands, in cooperation with the Association of German Priest Catechists in Munich and the International Center for Religious Education in Brussels, Belgium.

The resolutions said certain reforms for which suggestions were made at the study week would be published later, are indispensable in the catechetical field. Among the indispensable needs listed good new catechetical textbooks, especially in mission lands.

"More improvement of the old textbooks and catechisms is insufficient," said a resolution said, adding that another need is "a thorough and more adequate training of catechists, particularly with a view to developing spiritual leadership."

Among some 80 bishops attending the final sessions were Jaime Cardinal de Barros Camba, Archbishop of Rio de Janeiro, Brazil; and Valerian Cardinal Gracias, Archbishop of Bombay, India, who delivered the opening and closing addresses of the meeting. U.S. participants included Father Joseph B. Collins, director of the national Center of the Archconfraternity of Christian Doctrine and professor of catechetics at the Catholic University of America, Washington, D.C.

The Study Week was held just prior to the 37th International Eucharistic Congress in Munich. First of its kind between ranking prelates and catechetical experts, it was intended to explore new approaches to instructing converts in mission lands.

In his closing talk Cardinal Gracias declared that catechetical work in mission lands the Latin liturgy as witchcraft should aim not only at providing formulae rather than prayer.

ing converts with a true knowledge of the Catholic Faith, but also at fostering a deep spiritual dedication and apostolic spirit among them.

"In the missions," he said, "there has always been an overabundance of goodwill, but frequently there has been a lack of suitable leadership" to convert this goodwill into effective Christian action in the community.

Cardinal Gracias voiced the hope that the Study Week would "contribute toward terminating this situation."

In his opening address, the Indian prelate told the confreres that the basis for adopting the modern form of catechetics to mission requirements was the encyclical, "Principes Pastororum" of Pope John XXIII. He said catechists today have a threefold task to break the spell of heathenism, to Christianize the individual, and to turn him into an apostle himself.

Both European and African participants in the week stressed that a catechetical institution should focus on Christ and particularly on the mystery of His Death and Resurrection.

They said both missionaries and native priests were increasingly concerned about the fact that Christianity is often "put on" by converts like a dress, but not lived up to.

In this connection, the speakers stressed the need for an African liturgy, since a liturgy in Latin was not in accordance with their African mentality. They said there was a danger that believers might look upon them who were united to the Church with the sign of the Redeemer's Cross. Let us leave behind us animosity, division and prejudice and unpleasant comment. In these days of hard struggle for the Catholic Church, each of the faithful must feel the weight of his enormous responsibility toward humanity and remain strong in his faith."

**AID PROMISED**  
TO NATIONS

Moscow (RNS) — A resolution expressing solidarity with the peoples of the less developed countries in their "courageous fight" for recognition of their human dignity in economic, social and cultural fields" was adopted here by the general assembly of the Conference of International Catholic Organizations.

The assembly began just prior to the opening of the 37th International Eucharistic Congress.

In its resolution, the assembly stressed that one third of mankind possesses three-quarters of the world's income, while two-thirds are doomed to get along with the balance.

Calling the defection of the villagers "a sad reality," Bishop Mensa said that "those who refuse to obey the legitimate authority of the Church are shepherds of the Church are shepherds of the Church are to be pitied."
