

Columbus Squires Mark 35th Anniversary

Shortsville—The St. Dominic's Circle of Columbian Squires will help celebrate the 35th Anniversary of the founding of the Columbian Squires on Aug. 19. They will continue the program by attending the 8:30 Mass on Sunday and receiving Holy Communion in a body. At night they will entertain their parents with a supper and a special program.

The Squires were founded by the Supreme Council of Knights of Columbus in 1915. The first Circle was instituted in Duluth, Minn. The general purpose of the program is to supplement the teachings of the Church, Home and School by participation in a well balanced program under the guidance of exemplary Catholic men.

The program is fourfold: Civic Cultural, Spiritual, Physical and Social. Each program is under the guidance of a Counselor who is appointed by the Grand Knight of the Council sponsoring the Circle.

THE LOCAL UNITS are known as Circles and are supervised by the Council which has jurisdiction in the territory. The Circle belongs to an international group and also to a local group.

The Circle by its participation and reports of its activities can be classified as best Circle, Class A or B and poor.

Notre Dame Nuns Set Annual Education Meet

Sister M. Beatrice of Holy Family School, Rochester, will be among the 1600 School Sisters of Notre Dame attending the sixth annual Educational Conference of the congregation to be held August 17-20 at Notre Dame of the Lake, Mequon, Wisconsin.

SISTER BEATRICE will serve as a member of the Elementary Education Department of the Inter-Provincial Council. This council is composed of representatives from the six American provinces of the School Sisters of Notre Dame.

The Rev. John J. Evey, S.J., and the Rev. Van F. Christoph, S.J., of Gonzaga University, Spokane, Washington, will develop the theme of this year's conference, "The Dynamics of Personality Development."

There are about 11,500 School Sisters of Notre Dame serving in 16 countries. More than 6,500 of these belong to the province in the United States and Canada. Schools conducted by the SSNDs can be found in 33 States and four Canadian provinces. These provide for the education of almost 267,000 children and young adults.

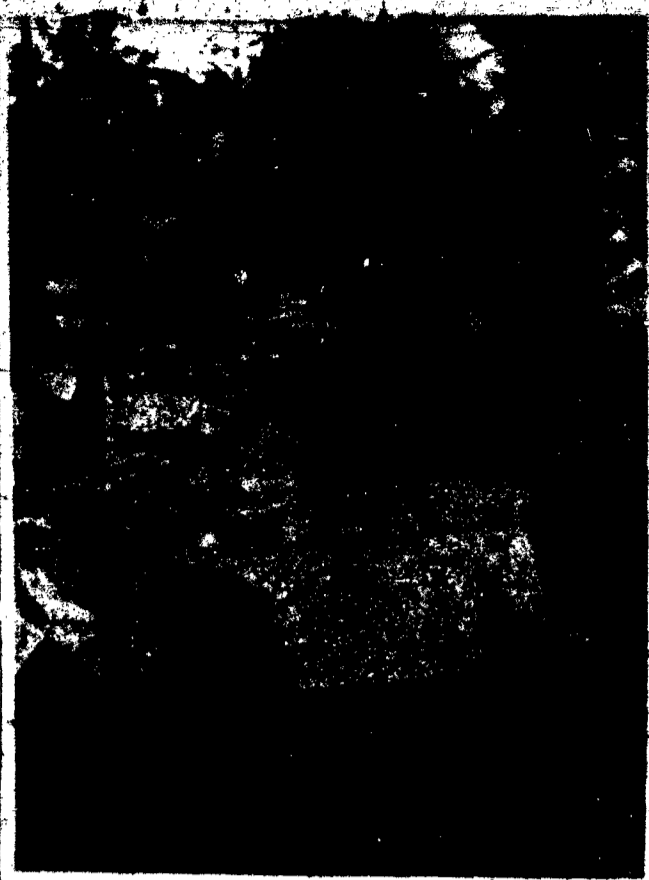
