Corningite Bishop Green Installed

Corning — A former Corningite and a frequent visitor to the city, Bishop Francis J. Green is now the official successor to Bishop Daniel J. Gercke, spiritual leader in the Diocese of Tucson, Ariz.

Officially designated coadjutor bishop of Tucson, with right to succession, Bishop Green took his place "in line" at a Pontifical High Mass on Aug. 15, the feast of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

Actual naming of the former Corningite to the honored position, was made by Pope John XXIII last May 6. The Pope's letter of designation was ordered to be read to the congregation on the next Holy Day, that of the Assumption.

An overflow crowd of laymen and religious leaders was on hand for the occasion, held in San Agustin Cathedral, where Bishop Green was ordained a priest in 1932, and where he was consecrated auxiliary bishop in 1953.
