The first annual Faculty Institute of St. Mary's Hospital was held on Thursday at the hospital campus this week. The institute was held in the hospital campus this week, with sessions opening Monday, Aug. 29, and continuing through Thursday, Sept. 1.

The institute, which brought some 30 instructors together in a conference, was designed to acquaint new faculty members with the philosophy and objectives of the School of Nursing and to coordinate the varied aspects of the nursing curriculum.

St. Mary's is expecting a record enrollment of 70 new freshmen students on Wednesday, Sept. 2, and has implemented its faculty to meet these expanding needs.

Sister Maria, Director of Nursing, in opening the institute, urged that the greatest importance be placed on the goal of educating, not merely a nurse, but a Catholic nurse. Sister also announced the inauguration of a Faculty Education Program to continue the work begun in the past.

Hornell Brewery
Resumes Operation
Hornell—The Hornell Brewing Co. has resumed full operation of its brewery under the ownership of Louis Hertzberg of New York City, owner of four other American and two overseas breweries.

Established in Hornell almost a century ago by the family of Herman Swarzenbach, a descendant of a line of master brewers in Bohemia, the Hornell brewery benefited from discovery of a natural spring in the vicinity. It was purchased in 1933 by Frank Elbert, Jr. of Buffalo, the late William A. Day of Buffalo and the late John Kingston Jr. of Elmira and operated continuously for 26 years until closed last September.

It was sold to Hertzberg for an undisclosed price this year by Elbert, Mrs. William Day, Mrs. Kenneth Cromwell of Buffalo, and Mr. and Mrs. Rudolph Schneider of North Hornell.

The Hornell Brewery has undergone complete modernization of brewing and bottling equipment, with Frank Wyant, brewmaster, and the original plant staff being retained. The company product is distributed in the Elmira area by Midstate Breweries Inc. of Elmira managed by Cecil and Don Beckmond, and in the Hornell area by Epso Beverages Inc.

Hertzberg is president of breweries in Chicago, Norfolk, Va., Trenton, N.J., and Pennsylvania, Fla., as well as one in Israel and another in South Africa.
