



Prepare For Mission Festival

Seminarians look over some of the prizes and entertainments for the annual Mission Day to be held at St. Michael's Divine Word Seminary, Conesus, on Sunday, Sept. 11. One of the main attractions will be the Mission display and exhibit in the Seminary gymnasium.

Grads Told Seek Jobs Of Service

New Orleans—(NC)—Catholic college graduates must put their education to work in social action, public service, delegates to the national convocation of Alpha Delta Gamma were told.

Brian Brown, professor of law at Loyola University of the South here, reminded the members of the national Catholic fraternity that leadership can be exercised through government, the mass communications media and teaching.

And, he added, "these are the areas which communists have been directed to infiltrate and exploit as channels for their subversive propaganda."

Mr. Brown deplored the possibility that Catholics would not seek careers in these fields because they do not pay as well as other fields.

"It would indeed be ironical," he said, "if the profit motive which has played such a praiseworthy role in generating psychological power for the capitalist system, should lure our best brains from careers of public leadership."



Ready Fashion Show

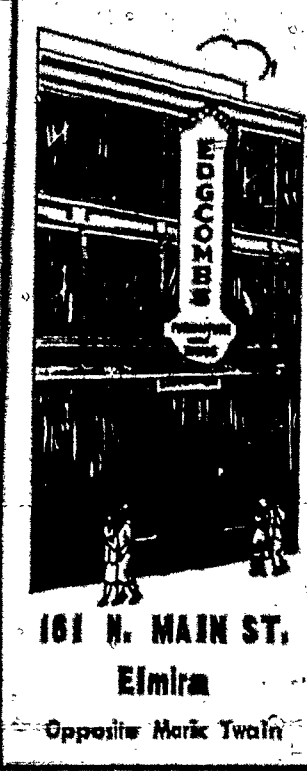
