Ladies Of Charity List First National Meet

The first national assembly of the American Association of the Ladies of Charity will meet at the Statler-Hilton Hotel, New York City from Sept. 23 to 25. Cardinal Spellman will give two Masses and will be a guest of honor at a reception. Cardinal McIntyre of Los Angeles will be a guest speaker at a Communion breakfast and Bishop Patrick A. O'Boyle, Archbishop of Washington, D.C., will give the sermon at Sunday Mass.

FOLLOWING WILL BE at breakfast conference held at the Waldorf-Astoria Grand Ballroom with Cardinal McIntyre as guest speaker. Sunday, Sept. 23 at 10 a.m. a solemn Pontifical Mass will be held at St. Patrick's Cathedral with Cardinal Spellman as celebrant and the sermon will be given by Archbishop O'Boyle.

At 4 p.m. a reception will be held at the Statler-Hilton Hotel with Cardinal Spellman as the guest of honor.

The Assembly will close with a reception on Monday, Sept. 25, from 4 to 7 p.m. at the Statler-Hilton Hotel and the New York Archdiocesan Ladies of Charity will be the hostesses.

All Ladies of Charity are invited and reservations may be obtained by calling Miss Mary E. Fitzgerald, RE 27197 before Sept. 12. Mrs. Fitzgerald, executive director of the Elmira Ladies of Charity, will be attending the assembly as their representative.

Speech Clinic Lists Opening At McAuley

Registration day for the fall term of the Reading Laboratory and Speech Clinic conducted by the Sisters of Mercy at Catherine McAuley College is Sept. 12. The Testing and Guidance Center will open on that date for individual testing appointments throughout the year.

REGISTRATION HOURS will be from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Monday. A parent is expected to come in person for each student registering for the first time, according to Sister Mary de Paul, dean of Catherine McAuley College, and director of the special services.

The Reading Laboratory has been functioning since 1961, offering remedial reading instruction on a non-technical basis to students of all ages and all faiths. Students' reading problems are diagnosed through standardized and clinical testing and handled through small-group instruction according to individual needs.

St. Mary's Pupils Begin Year In New School

Corning — Students were greeted to the new St. Mary's Parochial School Wednesday but the official dedication of the new Catholic elementary school will not take place until next spring.

Opening day attendance would be converted into a parish school's student capacity set at 500. The school now consists of 120 students with quarters for 120 additional students, plus the remodeled north building, work on which was completed last summer.

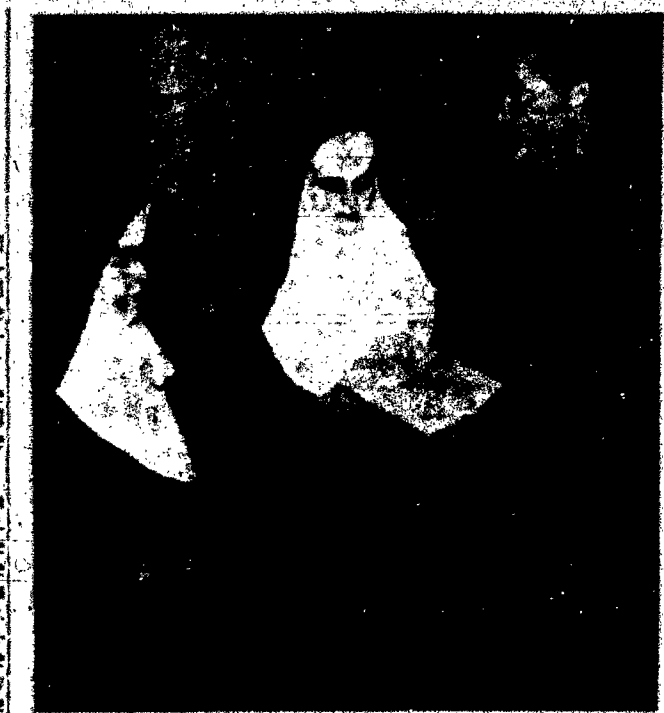
Furniture and equipment have been installed in the new quarters, with the exception of two approved by the chancery office of the diocese before contracts can be awarded.

98-Year Old Buffalo Pastor Given Testimonial By Basilian

A very active pastor and two of his former altar boys held a reunion at St. John Fisher College on Wednesday evening, August 31. The Right Rev. Msgr. Richard O'Brien, P.A., of Amnunciation Church, Buffalo, spent the day with Basilian Fathers Charles Donovan of Aquinas Institute and James Embser of St. John Fisher College.

Monsignor O'Brien is the oldest active priest in the country. A holy gentleman with flashing smile and kindly face, he is still devoting his time and energies to the work of conducting a large, urban parish. Each Sunday, he offers two Masses, and still takes his place regularly in the confessional on Saturday afternoon and evening.

THE MONSIGNOR was born in 1862, in Albion, during the Civil War days of Lincoln's presidency. When he decided to study for the priesthood, he chose St. Michael's College, conducted by the Basilian Fathers in Toronto.
