# I Baptized Buffalo Bill

New York — (NC) — The Walsh, 82, oldest priest of the Diocese of Buffalo, said he baptized William F. (Buffalo Bill) Cody in the Catholic faith the day before his death in Denver, Colo., in 1892. He is Father Christopher Walsh.



Father Walsh baptized the famous frontiersman and Indian fighter that day and Col. Cody died the following day.

## New Liverpool Cathedral

Liverpool — (RNS) — This winning design for the new Catholic Cathedral of Christ the King in Liverpool, England, was the work of Protestant architect Frederick Gibberd, the man who designed London Airport. Selection of the ultra-modern drawing was considered a striking departure for the Catholic Church in England which traditionally has been conservative in its architectural tastes. Work on the new cathedral, expected to take five years to complete, is scheduled to start in the spring of 1961.

Brisbane — (RNS) — The Catholic Archbishop of Brisbane has attacked modern ecclesiastical architecture as unable to inspire either the person or the good taste of the religious worshipper. He said the new forms should be "banned by the Church and the architectural profession."

## Credit Asked For Religion

Minneapolis, Minn. — (RNS) — The general of religious activities at Hamline State College has requested the Minnesota State College board to grant regular college credits for courses in religion.

The proposal was presented to the college board by clergyman serving Lutheran, Methodist, Presbyterian and Roman Catholic churches in behalf of students and other members of the council of religious advisors.
