2 Diocesan Teachers Take Valley Forge Awards

Sister Mary Beatrice, teacher of American history at Our Lady of Mercy High School, Rochester, and Mrs. Sara Fisher, world history teacher at Notre Dame High School in Elmira, have been named recipients of the 1959 Valley Forge Classroom Teachers' Medal Award. They are among 32 New York State teachers sharing this honor.

THE AWARDS were given the teachers for their "exceptional service in furthering the cause of responsible citizenship, patriotism, and a greater understanding and appreciation of the American way of life." They were selected by the Freedom Foundation's Independent, National and School Awards Jury.

Sister Mary Beatrice is currently teaching at Our Lady of Mercy High School. Sister is head of the citizenship education department and moderator of the Junior class. She formerly taught at Notre Dame High School. Mrs. Fisher has taught history at Notre Dame for the past five years and is audio-visual coordinator at the school.

Both teachers were nominated for the award by Notre Dame principal, Sister M. Raphael.
