Rev. Albert H. Schnacky, Diocesan Director of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine, and Sister Maureen, M.H.S.H., of the Assumption School of Religion, Fairport, will address sessions of the eleventh regional congress of the C.C.D. in Syracuse the week-end of Oct. 7-9.

Father Schnacky will speak to a session concerned with the religious education of students in high school. His talk will be given on Saturday, Oct. 8, at 7:30 p.m. in the East Room of the Hotel Syracuse. Topic is: "Basic Content of High School Religion Course for Public School Boys and Girls."

SISTER MAUREEN will speak in a special session for catechetical Sisters on Friday, Oct. 7, at 2:30 p.m. in Parlor D of the Hotel. Her topic will be: "Effective Use of Lay Religious Instruction Program."

FATHER SCHNACKY has thirty-three other speakers been Diocesan Director of the

Confraternity of Christian Doctrine since 1947. He prepared for the priesthood at St. Bernard's Seminary. He is also Rural Life Director. He became chaplain at the Motherhouse of the Sisters of St. Joseph and administrator of St. Catherine's Church in Mendon in 1956.

Sister Maureen, a Mission Helper of the Sacred Heart, has been engaged for many years in the catechetical work of the congregation. Sister Maureen's mission fields have included Brooklyn, Detroit, Baltimore, Trenton, and New York City. For the past few years she has been teaching in the Rochester Diocese, first at Ithaca, now at Fairport. During the summer she trained lay catechists in Maryland and Kentucky.

Collegians Offered Lay Apostolate Course

New fields in the lay apostolate are now opened to students of the Catholic colleges of Rochester. Beginning Tuesday, Oct. 4 at 4 p.m., the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine Teachers' Training Course will be given for those enrolled at Nazareth and St. John Fisher Colleges.

Classes will be held at Nazareth College once a week for 22 weeks, allowing for college semester holidays and will be concluded in April. Certificates as diocesan teachers of religion are awarded in May to all those who have successfully completed the course.

THIS PROGRAM provides an opportunity for young Catholics men and women to train in the future service of the Church as teachers of Religion. The course is conducted by Sister Maureen of the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart who operate Schools of Religion in Fairport and Victor.

At the same time, a similar course will be offered to other members of the laity at Assumption School of Religion, 10 Baumer Place, Fairport, on Mondays from 1 to 3 p.m. Rev. Leonard A. Kelly, pastor of the Church of the Assumption, will present the course in doctrine.

The method course will be given by Sister Maureen of the Mission Helpers of the Sacred Heart. This course which has been conducted for the past few years in the evening has now been scheduled for the afternoon for the convenience of those who could not attend the evening classes.

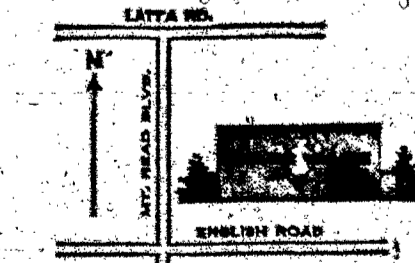
