19 Bishop Gives Absolution At Dr. O'Brien Rites

Funeral Mass for Dr. Elmer W. O'Brien, an ear, nose and throat specialist who for 40 years had been staff physician in St. Mary's Hospital was offered in Corpus Christi Church, Thursday, Sept. 21.

Doctor O'Brien, 83, of 240 Lake Rd., Webster died Sept. 25, 1960. He was the father of two in religion.

Bishop Kearney imparted the Absolution at the Mass and paid tribute to Doctor O'Brien.
