Other committee heads include Mary Ann Stack of Medina, in charge of hostesses, and Mary Mack of Elmira, of clean-up.

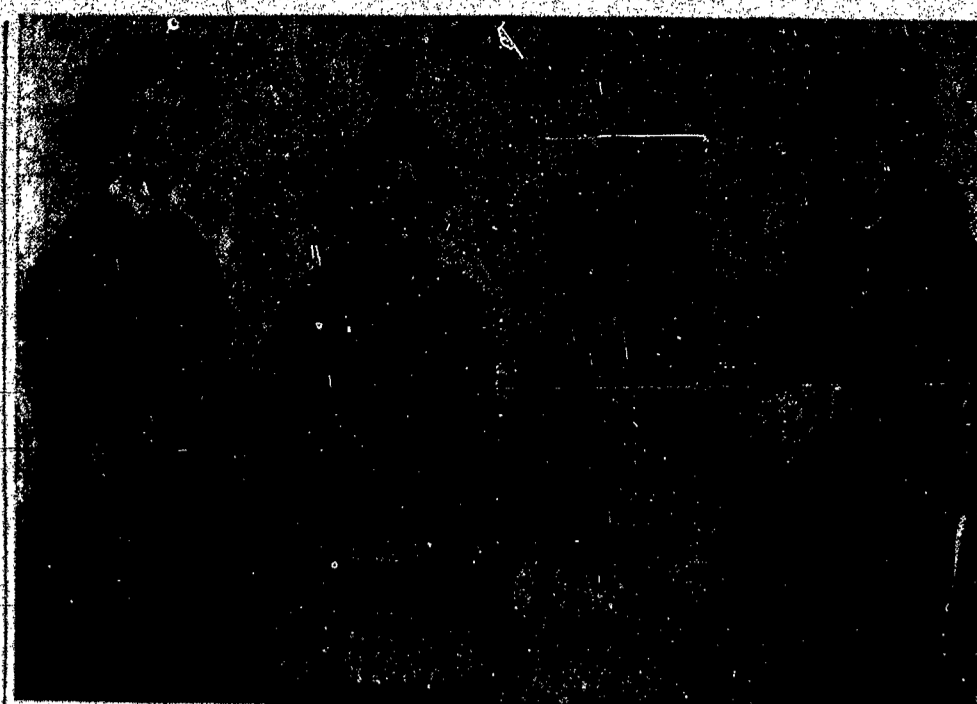
Miss Bregande Appointed To College Staff

6000 At Auriesville For AOH Pilgrimage

Hibernians from all corners of New York State met at Auriesville Sunday, Sept. 25, to celebrate the 75th anniversary of the first pilgrimage to the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs.

About 6,000 pilgrims were on hand. The Missa Cantata was celebrated at noon in the Shrine Coliseum by the Very Rev. James Shanahan, S.J., Prior Provincial of the Buffalo Province of the Society of Jesus.

THE PILGRIM reeled the Rosary and followed the Stations of the Cross on the grounds. The day's events closed at 4 p.m. with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament in the ravine which is believed to be the burial place of one of the North American Martyrs, St. Rene Goupil.

Hibernians marched to the Coliseum with their colors behind them. The Albany State President, Michael J. Lennon of Schenectady, an honor guard of Boy Scouts of the Albany and Syracuse dioceses lined the path up the hill to the Coliseum.

The New York State Board of the Ancient Order of Hibernians met in the Hotel Van Curler, Schenectady, the previous day, Saturday, Sept. 24. State President Lennon presided.

Representatives from the Msgr. John J. Lee Division, Elmira, were Jerome F. Hogan, state director, and Raymond E. Hourihan, division president.
