Membership Boost Given By Bishop

The 1960 membership campaign of the Catholic Youth Organization was formally opened with a dinner meeting at Columbus Civic Center last night attended by 200 workers.

Principal speaker was Bishop Kearney who emphasized the value of the proper use of leisure time and the importance of CYO programs in developing character of young people.

Judge Thomas J. Meszger, president of the CYO Board of Advisors, presided at the opening dinner and discussed the need of generous community support in the form of memberships in order to carry out plans for the coming year.

GENERAL CHAIRMAN Paul F. Morris introduced his campaign aides, including Joseph J. Miller, head of the special gifts committee, which has already obtained more than a thousand sponsored memberships and expects to produce 1,600 by the end of the campaign, and division chairmen Mrs. Joseph W. Denaro and Mark H. Toney, Jr.

The first report dinner will be held Oct. 15th and the closing dinner on Oct. 18. The overall quota for the campaign is 4,000 members.

However, the volume containing the collected acts of Pope John XXIII concerning the council is being made available to the public. This is because its entire contents have already been published at various intervals.

Meanwhile, the Secretariat for Christian Unity, presided over by Augustin Cardinal Bea, S.J., has set up headquarters in the Palazzo del Concilio.

The location is regarded as particularly fitting since the building was given by Cardinal Gerolamo Casaroli in 1888 as a hospital for those who have returned from heresy as an inscription on one wall states.

There are 10 pre-paratory commissions besides the central commission of patriarchs, archbishops, bishops and heads of religious orders.

They are: A theological commission, a commission of the bishops and diocesan government, a commission for discipline of clergy and faithful, a commission for religious, a commission for the discipline of the sacraments, a commission of the sacred liturgy, a commission for studies and seminaries, a commission for the Eastern Churches, a commission for the missions, and a commission for the lay apostolate.

There are three secretariats for Christian unity, for communications media, and an administrative one to expedite the council's organizational affairs.
