Father Boehm, Math Head Attends Meet

Rev. Frank C. Boehm, C.S.B., director of the department of mathematics at Aquinas Institute, attended a Regional Orientation Conference in Mathematics held in Philadelphia, Pa. on October 3 and 4 at the Hotel Sylvania.

Father Boehm represented the Catholic schools of Rochester at the conference, the first of its kind held throughout the United States this year.

THE PROGRAM, sponsored by the National Council of Teachers of Mathematics and supported by a grant from the National Science Foundation, is provided to help school systems strengthen their mathematics programs through the use of the new materials of instruction now available.

The aim of the project is to furnish supervisors and school administrators with the information and orientation they need in order that they may provide leadership in establishing improved mathematics programs in their school systems.

FATHER BOEHM, an Aquinas Institute graduate, has degrees from the University of Rochester, the University of Toronto, and has done extensive work in mathematics at the University of Buffalo and Columbia University.
