Off The Record Living Strings

One of the best record buys to a paper along in many months is a series of records released by RCA Camden. The series is called LIVING STRINGS. There are three records, all consisting of lush instrumentals. "Music Of The Sea" is the first of the series and recorded by Johnny Douglas.

It contains some of the most beautiful songs of the sea which have ever been composed—songs such as "Ebb Tide," "A Mermaid," "Aloha Oe," "Around The World" and "Sleepy Lagoon." The next album in the series is called "Music In The Night" and the music for this one was arranged and conducted by Bob Sharples. This one naturally consists of night songs—"Moonlight and Roses," "Stars In My Eyes," "Beautiful Dreamer," "Night Lights," "Moonlight in Vermont," "The Story of A Starry Night" and "Moonlight Becomes You."

THE THIRD ALBUM of LIVING STRINGS is "Music For Romance." Hill Bowen does the arranging and conducting for this one which contains such love songs as "Love Is A Many Splendored Thing," "Bewitched," "The Most Beautiful Girl In The World," "You Stepped Out Of A Dream" and "Nevertheless."

THE LIVING STRINGS orchestra was created exclusively for RCA. It is composed of Europe's finest string virtuosos. Each musician was chosen for technical excellence, richness of tone and wide orchestral experience.

The musicians play with unity and closeness, the arrangements are sophisticated but not overdone and the best part of the deal is that each of these records cost only \$1.99.
